## AN ACT

Amending the act of October 27, 1955 (P.L.744, No.222), entitled, as amended, "An act prohibiting certain practices 2 3 of discrimination because of race, color, religious creed, 4 ancestry, age or national origin by employers, employment 5 agencies, labor organizations and others as herein defined; creating the Pennsylvania Human Relations Commission in the 7 Department of Labor and Industry; defining its functions, powers and duties; providing for procedure and enforcement; 8 providing for formulation of an educational program to 9 10 prevent prejudice; providing for judicial review and 11 enforcement and imposing penalties," further providing for 12 discriminatory practice. 13 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 14 hereby enacts as follows: 15 Section 1. The act of October 27, 1955 (P.L.744, No.222), 16 known as the "Pennsylvania Human Relations Act," is amended by 17 adding a section to read: 18 Section 5.3. Additional Discriminatory Practice. -- It shall 19 be an unlawful discriminatory practice for any employer to 20 refuse to hire or employ any individual because such individual 21 is "over-qualified" or "over-educated" for the particular

- 1 position for which such individual is applying.
- 2 Section 2. Section 11 of the act, reenacted December 19,
- 3 1974 (P.L.966, No.318), is reenacted to read:
- 4 Section 11. Penalties. -- Any person who shall wilfully
- 5 resist, prevent, impede or interfere with the Commission, its
- 6 members, agents or agencies in the performance of duties
- 7 pursuant to this act, or shall wilfully violate an order of the
- 8 Commission, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon
- 9 conviction thereof, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not less
- 10 than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) nor more than five hundred
- 11 dollars (\$500.00), or to undergo imprisonment not exceeding
- 12 thirty (30) days, or both, in the discretion of the court, but
- 13 procedure for the review of an order shall not be deemed to be
- 14 such wilful conduct.
- 15 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
