AN ACT

1 Amending the act of July 12, 1972 (P.L.769, No.182), entitled
2 "An act relating to certain documents, prescribing the fees
3 for the Department of State and certain public officers,
4 permitting the filing of certain documents appropriating the
5 exclusive right to a corporate name, repealing the excise tax
6 on the capital stock of domestic corporations and repealing
7 inconsistent acts," further defining "ancillary transaction."

8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
9 hereby enacts as follows:

10 Section 1. Section 2, act of July 12, 1972 (P.L.769,
11 No.182), entitled "An act relating to certain documents,
12 prescribing the fees for the Department of State and certain
13 public officers, permitting the filing of certain documents
14 appropriating the exclusive right to a corporate name, repealing
15 the excise tax on the capital stock of domestic corporations and
16 repealing inconsistent acts," is amended to read:

17 Section 2. In the case of any document or paper relating to
18 corporations, for the purposes of administering this act, the
19 term "ancillary transaction" shall include reservation of name,
20 preclearance of document, amendment of articles or charter,

1 restatement of articles or charter, [change in registered or
2 principal office,] change in share structure, increase or
3 decrease in capital stock, conversion, election to dissolve,
4 dissolution, reorganization, withdrawal by foreign corporation,
5 or any similar transaction, or the deposit in the Department of
6 State for filing in, by or with the Department of State or the
7 Secretary of the Commonwealth of any articles, statements,
8 proceedings, agreements, decrees, officer's return or any like
9 papers affecting corporations under the statutes of this
10 Commonwealth.

11 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
