1 Cheap labor in foreign countries makes it possible to produce
2 shoes there and sell them here at prices lower than the price
3 required for those produced in Pennsylvania. Flooding of the
4 markets of the United States with such foreign made items
5 results in the loss of jobs for our workmen. The only effective
6 way to prevent such harmful activities is to establish and
7 enforce import quotas; therefore be it

8 RESOLVED (the Senate concurring), That the General Assembly
9 of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania memorialize the President of
10 the United States to establish quotas on the importation of
11 shoes into this Nation and strictly enforce the application of
12 the quotas set by him for the protection of the welfare of the
13 citizens of this Commonwealth and its industries engaged in the
14 production of shoes.
