In the House of Representatives, May 24, 1977

1 WHEREAS, There is a shortage of energy in all its form; and

2 WHEREAS, One of the chief users of energy is the buildings in  
3 which we live and work; and

4 WHEREAS, Conservation of energy could greatly extend the  
5 amount of energy available to the citizens; and

6 WHEREAS, Lighting and ventilating standards provide for the  
7 health and safety but may be a source of energy waste; and

8 WHEREAS, A re-evaluation of these standards may provide  
9 standards which provide both health and safety and proper  
10 conservation of energy; therefore be it

11 RESOLVED, That the General Assembly direct the Secretary of  
12 Labor and Industry to institute immediately, a study into the  
13 lighting and ventilating standards promulgated and enforced by  
14 his department; and be it further

15 RESOLVED, That the secretary report back to the General  
16 Assembly within 90 days with a report on this evaluation and any  
17 changes made to the standards.
