## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 66 (Public Utilities) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, providing for the election of public
- 3 utility commissioners.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 301 of Title 66, act of November 25, 1970
- 7 (P.L.707, No.203), added July 1, 1978 (No.116), is amended to
- 8 read:
- 9 § 301. Establishment, members, qualifications and chairman.
- 10 (a) Appointment and terms of members.--The Pennsylvania
- 11 Public Utility Commission, established by the act of March 31,
- 12 1937 (P.L.160, No.43), as an independent administrative
- 13 commission, is hereby continued as such and shall consist of
- 14 [five members who shall be appointed by the Governor, by and
- 15 with the advice and consent of two-thirds of all the members of
- 16 the Senate, for a term of ten years. No commissioner upon the
- 17 expiration of his term shall continue to hold office until his
- 18 successor shall be duly appointed or shall be qualified] five
- 19 elected members. Three of the members shall be elected for four-

- 1 year terms and two of the members shall be elected for two-year
- 2 terms. Terms shall begin January 1 following their election. In
- 3 the event of a vacancy the Governor shall appoint a person to
- 4 <u>fill the unexpired term. The Commonwealth shall be divided by</u>
- 5 the reapportionment commission into five utility districts of
- 6 equal population and one commissioner shall be elected from each
- 7 <u>district</u>.
- 8 <u>Nomination and election of a candidate for the office of</u>
- 9 <u>Commissioner of the Public Utility Commission shall be governed</u>
- 10 by the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), known as the
- 11 "Pennsylvania Election Code." Nominating petitions shall contain
- 12 2,500 signatures of the electorate registered with the
- 13 candidate's party and residing in the candidate's district. If
- 14 the district contains two or more counties not more than 50% of
- 15 <u>the signatures shall be from one county.</u>
- 16 (b) Qualifications and restrictions. -- Each commissioner, at
- 17 the time of his [appointment] election and qualification, shall
- 18 be a resident of this Commonwealth and shall have been a
- 19 qualified elector therein for a period of at least one year next
- 20 preceding his appointment, and shall also be not less than 30
- 21 years of age. No person shall be [appointed] elected a member of
- 22 the commission or hold any place, position or office under it,
- 23 who occupies any official relation to any public utility or who
- 24 holds any other appointive or elected office of the Commonwealth
- 25 or any political subdivision thereof. Commencing July 1, 1977,
- 26 commissioners shall devote full time to their official duties.
- 27 No commissioner shall hold any office or position, the duties of
- 28 which are incompatible with the duties of his office as
- 29 commissioner, or be engaged in any business, employment or
- 30 vocation, for which he shall receive any remuneration, except as

- 1 provided in this chapter. No employee, appointee or official
- 2 engaged in the service of or in any manner connected with, the
- 3 commission shall hold any office or position, or be engaged in
- 4 any employment or vocation, the duties of which are incompatible
- 5 with his employment in the service of or in connection with the
- 6 work of the commission. No commissioner shall be paid or accept
- 7 for any service connected with the office, any fee or emolument
- 8 other than the salary and expenses provided by law. No
- 9 commissioner shall participate in any hearing or proceeding in
- 10 which he has any direct or indirect pecuniary interest. Within
- 11 90 days of confirmation, each commissioner shall disclose, at
- 12 that time and thereafter annually, the existence of all security
- 13 holdings in any public utility or its affiliates held by such
- 14 commissioner, his or her spouse and any minor or unemancipated
- 15 children and must either divest or place in a blind trust such
- 16 securities. As used in this part, blind trust means a trust over
- 17 which neither the commissioners, their spouses, nor any minor or
- 18 unemancipated children shall exercise any managerial control,
- 19 and from which neither the commissioners, their spouses, nor any
- 20 minor or unemancipated children shall receive any income from
- 21 the trust during the commissioner's tenure of office. Such
- 22 disclosure statement shall be filed with the secretary of the
- 23 commission and shall be open to inspection by the public during
- 24 the normal business hours of the commission during the tenure of
- 25 the commissioner. Every commissioner, and every individual or
- 26 official, elected, employed or appointed to office under, in the
- 27 service of, or in connection with, the work of the commission,
- 28 is forbidden, directly or indirectly, to solicit or request
- 29 from, or to suggest or recommend to any public utility, or to
- 30 any officer, attorney, agent or employee thereof, the

- 1 appointment of any individual to any office, place or position
- 2 in, or the employment of any individual in any capacity by, such
- 3 public utility. Every commissioner, every bureau director and
- 4 every administrative law judge <u>elected</u>, employed or appointed to
- 5 office under, in the service of or in connection with the work
- 6 of the commission, is prohibited from accepting employment with
- 7 any public utility subject to the rules and regulations of the
- 8 commission for a period of one year after terminating employment
- 9 or service with the commission. Every elected commissioner is
- 10 prohibited from seeking a Statewide elected position, a seat in
- 11 the Pennsylvania House of Representatives, a seat in the
- 12 Pennsylvania Senate, a seat in the United States House of
- 13 Representatives or a seat in the United States Senate for a
- 14 period of three years after terminating his service as a
- 15 <u>commissioner</u>. No person shall be elected commissioner if he was
- 16 employed by a public utility during the three years prior to his
- 17 <u>election</u>. If any person, <u>elected</u>, employed or appointed in the
- 18 service of the commission violates any provision of this
- 19 section, the commission shall forthwith remove him from the
- 20 office or employment held by him.
- 21 (c) Chairman. -- A member designated by the [Governor]
- 22 commissioners shall be the chairman of the commission [during
- 23 such member's term of office] for a one-year term commencing
- 24 January 3 and shall not be eliqible for a second term. When
- 25 present, the chairman shall preside at all meetings, but in his
- 26 absence a member, designated by the chairman, shall preside and
- 27 shall exercise, for the time being, all the powers of the
- 28 chairman. The chairman shall have such powers and duties as
- 29 authorized by the commission as provided in section 331(b)
- 30 (relating to powers of commission and administrative law

- 1 judges).
- 2 (d) Quorum.--A majority of the members of the commission
- 3 serving in accordance with law shall constitute a quorum and
- 4 such majority, acting unanimously, shall be required for any
- 5 action, including the making of any order or the ratification of
- 6 any act done or order made by one or more of the commissioners.
- 7 No vacancy in the commission shall impair the right of a quorum
- 8 of the commissioners to exercise all the rights and perform all
- 9 the duties of the commission.
- 10 (e) Compensation.--Each of the commissioners shall receive
- 11 an annual salary of [\$35,000, as of January 1, 1977, and
- 12 \$40,000, as of January 1, 1978,] <u>\$19,000</u>, except the chairman,
- 13 who shall receive an annual salary of [\$37,500, as of January 1,
- 14 1977, and \$42,500, as of January 1, 1978] <u>\$20,000</u>.
- 15 (f) Open proceedings.--The proceedings of the commission
- 16 shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of the act
- 17 of July 19, 1974 (P.L.486, No.175), referred to as the Public
- 18 Agency Open Meeting Law.
- 19 (q) Monitoring cases.--Each commissioner shall be
- 20 responsible for monitoring specified cases as shall be assigned
- 21 to him in a manner determined by the commission. All proceedings
- 22 properly before the commission shall be assigned immediately
- 23 upon filing.
- 24 Section 2. Terms of Public Utility Commission commissioners
- 25 appointed before the effective date of this act shall terminate
- 26 on the election and qualification of elected Public Utility
- 27 Commission commissioners.
- 28 Section 3. This act shall take effect January 1, 1980.
