## A JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth
of Pennsylvania, reducing the number of Senators and members of the House of Representatives.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby resolves as follows:

Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with the provisions of Article XI thereof:

That section 16, Article II be amended to read:
§ 16. Legislative districts.
The Commonwealth shall for the years 1992 through 2001 be divided into [50] 46 senatorial and [203] 184 representative districts and for the year 2002 and thereafter be divided into 40 senatorial and 160 representative districts, which shall be composed of compact and contiguous territory as nearly equal in population as practicable. Each senatorial district shall elect one Senator, and each representative district one

Representative. Unless absolutely necessary no county, city,
incorporated town, borough, township or ward shall be divided in forming either a senatorial or representative district.

SCHEDULE
For the years 1992 through 2001, the Commonwealth shall be reapportioned not later than February 1, 1991 leased upon the tabulations of the 1990 Federal decennial census.

For the year 2002 and thereafter, the Commonwealth shall be reapportioned not later than February 1, 2001 based upon the tabulations of the 2000 Federal decennial census.
