AN ACT

Amending the act of December 15, 1959 (P.L.1779, No.673), 2 entitled, as amended, "An act relating to fish, frogs, 3 tadpoles and turtles; and amending, revising, consolidating and changing the law relating to fish in the inland waters 5 and the boundary lakes and boundary rivers of the Commonwealth, providing for a reduced fishing license fee 7 for blind persons. 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. Subsection (a) of section 220, act of December 11 15, 1959 (P.L.1779, No.673), known as "The Fish Law of 1959," amended November 26, 1978 (P.L.1205, No.282), is amended to 12 13 read: 14 Section 220. Resident Fishing License; Fees. -- (a) For the 15 purposes of this article, every person sixteen years of age and 16 upward, upon application to any issuing agent within the Commonwealth, or to the Commission, and upon the establishment 17 18 of his identity and age to the satisfaction of the issuing agent or the Commission by producing a motor vehicle operator's permit 19 20 or some other positive means of identification and age, that he is a bona fide resident of this Commonwealth or a member of the 21

- 1 Armed Forces of the United States who is on full-time active
- 2 duty and permanently assigned to a military installation located
- 3 within the Commonwealth, shall, upon the payment to the issuing
- 4 agent or the Commission of a license fee of nine dollars (\$9.00)
- 5 except as hereinafter provided for persons sixty-five years of
- 6 age and over for the use of the Commonwealth, and in the event
- 7 that the license is issued by an issuing agent, a fee of twenty-
- 8 five cents (25¢) for the use of the issuing agent, be entitled
- 9 to the license herein referred to as a "resident fishing
- 10 license." Residents with the above qualifications, who are
- 11 sixty-five or more years of age or who are blind persons as
- 12 <u>defined in section 502, act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21)</u>,
- 13 known as the "Public Welfare Code," at the time of application,
- 14 shall be entitled to a "senior resident fishing license" upon
- 15 payment to said agent or the Commission of a license fee of two
- 16 dollars (\$2.00) for the use of the Commonwealth, and in the
- 17 event that the license is issued by an issuing agent, a fee of
- 18 twenty-five cents (25¢) for the use of the issuing agent. The
- 19 license in such cases shall, in addition to the other
- 20 information required, give the date of birth of the applicant.
- 21 Any person who qualifies to purchase a senior resident license
- 22 may, in lieu thereof, purchase a senior resident license which
- 23 shall be valid for his lifetime upon the payment of a fee of ten
- 24 dollars (\$10.00) for the use of the Commonwealth, and in the
- 25 event the license is issued by an issuing agent, a fee of
- 26 twenty-five cents (25¢) for the use of the issuing agent.

- 28 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
