AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of October 7, 1976 (P.L.1090, No.218), entitled
- 2 "An act relating to abuse of adults and children by a person
- who resides with them; and providing for remedies and
- 4 procedures, " further providing for emergency relief.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Section 8, act of October 7, 1976 (P.L.1090,
- 8 No.218), known as the "Protection From Abuse Act," amended June
- 9 23, 1978 (P.L.513, No.81), is amended to read:
- 10 Section 8. Emergency Relief. -- (a) When the court is
- 11 unavailable [from the close of business at the end of the week
- 12 to the resumption of business at the beginning of the week] a
- 13 petition may be filed before a district justice or Philadelphia
- 14 Municipal Court Judge who may grant relief in accordance with
- 15 section 6(a), (2) or (3) if the district justice or Philadelphia
- 16 Municipal Court Judge deems it necessary to protect the
- 17 plaintiff or minor children from abuse, upon good cause shown in
- 18 an ex-parte proceeding. Immediate and present danger of abuse to

- 1 the plaintiff or minor children shall constitute good cause for
- 2 purposes of this section.
- 3 (b) Any order issued under subsection (a) shall expire as of
- 4 the resumption of business of the court [at the beginning of the
- 5 week] or within 72 hours, whichever occurs sooner; at which
- 6 time, the plaintiff may seek a temporary order from the court.
- 7 (c) Any order issued under this section and any
- 8 documentation in support thereof shall be immediately certified
- 9 to the court. Such certification to the court shall have the
- 10 effect of commencing proceedings under section 4 and invoking
- 11 the other provisions of this act.
- 12 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 30 days.
