REFERRED TO COMMITTEE ON APPROPRIATIONS, OCTOBER 23, 1979

AN ACT

1 Amending the act of July 4, 1979 (No.10A), entitled "An act
2 appropriating the Federal Augmentation to the Executive and
3 Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth and establishing
4 restricted receipts accounts for the fiscal period July 1,
5 1979 to June 30, 1980 and for the payment of bills incurred
6 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending
7 June 30, 1979," changing appropriations and adding
8 appropriations.

9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
10 hereby enacts as follows:

11 Section 1. So much as relates to the appropriations to the
12 Governor's Office and the Departments of Aging, Agriculture,
13 Commerce, Community Affairs, Education, Environmental Resources,
14 Health, Justice and Public Welfare of section 3, act of July 4,
15 1979 (No.10A), known as the "Federal Augmentation Appropriation
16 Act of 1979," are amended and appropriations are added to read:

17 Section 3. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be
18 necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Federal
19 augmentation funds to the several hereinafter named agencies of
20 the Executive and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for

1 the payment of the expenses of implementing and carrying out the
2 programs stated herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
