AN ACT

1 Amending the act of July 4, 1979 (P.L.665, No.10A), entitled "An
2 act appropriating the Federal Augmentation to the Executive
3 and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth and establishing
4 restricted receipts accounts for the fiscal period July 1,
5 1979 to June 30, 1980 and for the payment of bills incurred
6 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending
7 June 30, 1979," changing appropriations and adding
8 appropriations.

9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
10 hereby enacts as follows:

11 Section 1. As much of sections 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7, act of July <—
