REFERRED TO COMMITTEE ON RULES, MARCH 18, 1980

In the House of Representatives, March 18, 1980

1 WHEREAS, the House Select Committee - TMI found that the
2 radiation monitoring devices in place in the vicinity of the TMI
3 facility were not of the type capable of detecting immediate low
4 or high level airborne releases of radioactive material; and

5 WHEREAS, The committee found that there was no continuous
6 monitoring system in place to provide necessary input to the
7 appropriate State and local emergency management agencies;
8 therefore be it

9 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urges the
10 Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency and the Department of
11 Environmental Resources to install radiation monitoring devices
12 as necessary, within the potential danger areas surrounding all
13 nuclear plants in the Commonwealth, said equipment to be such
14 that continuous and accurate information is continuously relayed
15 to Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency and the Department
16 of Environmental Resources; and be it further

1 RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to
2 the Governor of the Commonwealth, the Pennsylvania Emergency
3 Management Agency and the Secretary of Environmental Resources.
