AN ACT

Amending the act of May 31, 1978 (No.16A), entitled "An act to 2 provide for the expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, the public debt and 3 4 for the public schools for the fiscal period July 1, 1978 to 5 June 30, 1979, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending 6 June 30, 1978, " increasing the appropriation to the 7 Pennsylvania State Police. 8 9 TO PROVIDE FOR THE EXPENSES OF THE EXECUTIVE, LEGISLATIVE AND 10 JUDICIAL DEPARTMENTS OF THE COMMONWEALTH, THE PUBLIC DEBT AND 11 FOR THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS FOR THE FISCAL PERIOD JULY 1, 1979 TO JUNE 30, 1980, AND FOR THE PAYMENT OF BILLS INCURRED AND 12 13 REMAINING UNPAID AT THE CLOSE OF THE FISCAL PERIOD ENDING 14 JUNE 30, 1979. 15 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 16 hereby enacts as follows: 17 Section 1. So much as relates to the salaries and expenses of the Pennsylvania State Police in section 2, act of May 31, 18 1978 (No.16A) known as the "General Appropriation Act of 1978," vetoed in part March 7, 1979 (No.1A), are reenacted and amended 21 to read: 22 Section 2. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be

- 3 Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the

- 7 rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods, services,
- 8 printing, equipment, land and buildings and for payment of any
- 9 other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for
- 10 the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and
- 11 for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal period
- 12 beginning July 1, 1978 and for the payment of bills incurred and
- 13 remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June
- 14 30, 1978.
