AN ACT

Amending the act of May 7, 1923 (P.L.158, No.119), entitled "An 2 act creating a Legislative Reference Bureau; providing for 3 the election of a director by the General Assembly; designating the officers and employes of such bureau, 5 defining their duties; fixing their salaries; abolishing the 6 present Legislative Reference Bureau; and making an 7 appropriation, "further providing for the bureau and making 8 certain repeals. 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 10 hereby enacts as follows: 11 The title and section 2, act of May 7, 1923 Section 1. 12 (P.L.158, No.119), entitled "An act creating a Legislative Reference Bureau; providing for the election of a director by 13 14 the General Assembly; designating the officers and employes of 15 such bureau, defining their duties; fixing their salaries; 16 abolishing the present Legislative Reference Bureau; and making 17 an appropriation, " are amended to read: 18 AN ACT Creating a Legislative Reference Bureau[; providing for the 19 20 election of a director by the General Assembly] and a

- 1 <u>Legislative Reference Bureau Supervising Committee</u>;
- designating the officers and employes of such bureau,
- defining their duties; fixing their salaries; abolishing the
- 4 present Legislative Reference Bureau; and making an
- 5 appropriation.
- 6 Section 2. [The Legislative Reference Bureau shall be in
- 7 charge of a director, who shall be elected, as soon as may be
- 8 after the passage of this act and biennially thereafter before
- 9 the first day of February, each odd-numbered year, by the Senate
- 10 and House of Representatives in joint session. The Director of
- 11 the present Legislative Reference Bureau in office at the time
- 12 of the approval of this act shall, until an election is held
- 13 under this act, hold the office of Director of the Legislative
- 14 Reference Bureau created by this act, subject to removal by the
- 15 General Assembly.]
- 16 (a) There is hereby created the Legislative Reference Bureau
- 17 Supervising Committee which shall consist of the President pro
- 18 tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of
- 19 Representatives, the Minority Leader of the Senate, the Minority
- 20 <u>Leader of the House of Representatives, the Attorney General or</u>
- 21 <u>his designee, the President of the Pennsylvania Bar Association</u>
- 22 or his designee, the Court Administrator of Pennsylvania or his
- 23 <u>designee</u>. Each such officer of the Senate or the House of
- 24 Representatives may designate another member of the respective
- 25 Houses to be a member of the committee in their stead or to act
- 26 temporarily on behalf of such officer. Members of the committee
- 27 shall serve during each regular session of the General Assembly
- 28 and shall continue as members until the third Tuesday in January
- 29 of the next odd-numbered year and until their respective
- 30 successors shall qualify provided in the case of members of the

- 1 General Assembly that they continue to be members of the Senate
- 2 or House of Representatives. The committee shall have a
- 3 continuing existence and may meet and conduct its business at
- 4 any place within the Commonwealth during the sessions of the
- 5 Legislature or any recess thereof and in the interim between
- 6 sessions. Four members of the committee shall constitute a
- 7 quorum and an affirmative vote of four members of the committee
- 8 shall be necessary to pass on any matter requiring committee
- 9 <u>action</u>.
- 10 (b) The Legislative Reference Bureau Supervising Committee
- 11 <u>shall supervise all the affairs of the Legislative Reference</u>
- 12 Bureau and it shall select a director who is learned in the law,
- 13 an assistant director, who is learned in the law and who is a
- 14 skilled bill drafter. The committee shall provide for the
- 15 <u>selection of a trained librarian and such attorneys-at-law</u>,
- 16 clerks, secretaries, stenographers, typists, messengers and
- 17 other employes as it deems necessary for such periods and on
- 18 such terms as it deems advantageous to conduct the work of the
- 19 bureau and it shall provide for their qualifications and duties.
- 20 The committee shall fix the number and establish a compensation
- 21 plan for the director and all such employes within the limits of
- 22 the appropriation made by the General Assembly. The assistant
- 23 director shall perform the duties of the director in the case of
- 24 a vacancy in said office or in the case of the absence or
- 25 <u>inability of the director to act and he shall also perform such</u>
- 26 other duties as may be assigned to him by the Legislative
- 27 Reference Bureau Supervising Committee or the director.
- 28 Section 2. Sections 4 and 5 of the act are repealed.
- 29 Section 3. (a) The present Director of the Legislative
- 30 Reference Bureau in office at the time of the approval of this

- 1 act shall remain in office for a period of 30 days during which
- 2 such time the Legislative Reference Bureau Supervising Committee
- 3 shall select a director from those applicants who submit their
- 4 qualifications to the committee for consideration.
- 5 (b) Any employe appointed on or before January 1, 1979 shall
- 6 be retained as an employe and shall only be discharged for
- 7 cause. The appointments of any other employe shall terminate 60
- 8 days after the effective date of this act unless the committee
- 9 shall act to reappoint such employe within 45 days of the
- 10 effective date of this act.
- 11 Section 4. Section 49, act of January 10, 1968 (1967)
- 12 P.L.925, No.417), referred to as the Legislative Officers and
- 13 Employes Law, is repealed.
- 14 Section 5. This act shall take effect immediately.
