14	Section 1. The act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as

17	Section 208.1. Revocation of License(A) The department	<—
18	shall have the power to revoke any license issued pursuant to	
19	section 208 for any violation of this article.	
20	(B) UPON DETERMINING THAT A VIOLATION OF THIS ARTICLE OR THE	<—
21	RULES AND REGULATIONS PROMULGATED THEREUNDER EXISTS, THE	

1 DEPARTMENT SHALL ISSUE A NOTICE OF VIOLATION. SUCH NOTICE SHALL 2 SPECIFY THE NATURE OF THE VIOLATION, ORDER THE VIOLATION ABATED 3 AND SHALL SPECIFY A REASONABLE TIME FOR COMPLIANCE. IF, AFTER 4 SUCH REASONABLE TIME FOR COMPLIANCE, THE DEPARTMENT DETERMINES 5 THAT SUCH VIOLATION PERSISTS, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL AFFORD THE HOLDER OF THE LICENSE AN OPPORTUNITY FOR AN ADMINISTRATIVE 6 7 HEARING BEFORE THE DEPARTMENT. IF, AFTER THE DEPARTMENT HEARING, 8 THE DEPARTMENT RULES THAT THE LICENSE SHALL BE REVOKED, APPEALS 9 MAY BE TAKEN IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROCEDURES PROVIDED IN 10 SECTIONS 234 THROUGH 236 OF THIS ARTICLE. 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days and shall

12 apply to any violation occurring on or after the effective date 13 of this act.
