AN ACT

1 2 3	Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the
4	Executive Department thereof and the administrative
5	departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof,
6	including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or
7	Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or
8	authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative
9	departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and
10	duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative
11	officers, and of the several administrative departments,
12	boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the
13	Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive
14	and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of
15	certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and
16	other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards,
17	and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the
18	number and compensation of the deputies and all other
19	assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and
20	commissions shall be determined," further providing for
21	membership on the State Board of Cosmetology.
22	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
23	hereby enacts as follows:
24	Section 1. Section 459, act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177,
25	No.175), known as "The Administrative Code of 1929," amended
26	November 26, 1978 (P.L.1223, No.292), is amended to read:

1 Section 459. State Board of Cosmetology.--(a) The State Board of Cosmetology shall consist of seven persons who have 2 3 been citizens of this State for at least five years prior to 4 their appointment and shall be residents of the Commonwealth during their term of office. Such board shall be appointed by 5 the Governor. Five members of the board shall be at least 6 7 twenty-five years of age and shall have had at least five years' 8 practical experience in the majority of the practices of 9 cosmetology. [One member of the board may be the owner of a 10 school of cosmetology but two members of said board shall not be 11 graduates of the same school.] The sixth and seventh members of the board shall be persons representing the public at large. \underline{A} 12 13 board member shall not have any affiliation with or maintain a financial interest in any school of cosmetology or school of 14 15 barbering located in this Commonwealth. Board members shall serve for the following terms of office: 16 (1) One member of the board designated by the Commissioner 17 18 of Professional and Occupational Affairs shall serve until the expiration of one year after the effective date of this 19 20 amendatory act; one member designated by the commissioner shall serve until the expiration of two years after that effective 21 date; one member designated by the commissioner shall serve 22 23 until the expiration of three years after that effective date; 24 one member designated by the commissioner shall serve until the expiration of four years after that effective date; one member 25 26 designated by the commissioner shall serve until the expiration 27 of six years after that effective date. The two members of the 28 board representing the public at large shall serve until the 29 expiration of one year after that effective date. 30 (2) Upon the completion of the respective terms of office

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1 specified in clause (1) of this subsection, subsequently

2 <u>appointed board members shall serve a four-year term.</u>

3 <u>Subsequently appointed board members representing the public at</u>

4 large shall serve a one-year term.

5 (b) The board shall elect one of its members as chairman and 6 shall elect a secretary who need not be a member of the board 7 who shall have such powers and shall perform such duties, not 8 contrary to law, as the board shall prescribe.

9 (c) Four members of the board shall constitute a quorum and 10 any action or order of the board shall require the approval of 11 at least four members.

12 (d) The members of the board shall receive thirty dollars 13 (\$30) per diem for each day actually devoted to the work of the 14 board and the secretary shall receive such reasonable 15 compensation as shall be determined by the board, with the 16 approval of the Commissioner of Professional and Occupational 17 Affairs.

18 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
