## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 2 Statutes, further providing for abandoned vehicles on limited
- 3 access highways.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 3712 of Title 75, act of November 25,
- 7 1970 (P.L.707, No.230), known as the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 8 Statutes, is amended to read:
- 9 § 3712. Abandonment and stripping of vehicles.
- 10 (a) Abandonment on highway. -- No person shall abandon a
- 11 vehicle upon any highway. Any person abandoning a vehicle on a
- 12 limited access highway shall, within 12 hours, notify the law
- 13 <u>enforcement authorities having jurisdiction of such abandonment</u>
- 14 and shall, within the next 12 hours, have the abandoned vehicle
- 15 removed from the highway.
- 16 (b) Abandonment on public or private property.--No person
- 17 shall abandon a vehicle upon any public or private property
- 18 without the express or implied consent of the owner or person in

- 1 lawful possession or control of the property.
- 2 (c) Stripping abandoned vehicle. -- It is unlawful for any
- 3 person, except the owner or his agent or as otherwise provided
- 4 in this title, to remove any part of an abandoned vehicle.
- 5 (d) Penalties.--
- 6 (1) Any person violating subsection (a) or (b) is guilty
- of a summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced
- 8 to pay a fine of \$50 plus all costs of disposing of the
- 9 vehicle under the provisions of Chapter 73 (relating to
- 10 abandoned vehicles and cargos).
- 11 (2) Any person violating subsection (c):
- (i) For a first offense, is guilty of a summary
- offense punishable by a fine of not less than \$100 nor
- 14 more than \$500.
- 15 (ii) For a subsequent offense, is guilty of a
- misdemeanor of the third degree.
- 17 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
