In the House of Representatives, April 22, 1981

- 1 WHEREAS, Various officials of the Federal Railway
- 2 Administration (FRA) and of the United States Department of
- 3 Transportation have released preliminary statements calling for
- 4 the dissolution of Conrail within the next few years; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania General Assembly recognizes that
- 6 Conrail provides vital transportation services and is an
- 7 integral part of the economy of the Commonwealth and of the
- 8 Northeast Region of the United States; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The General Assembly has in past sessions enacted
- 10 legislation aimed at assisting Conrail in implementing its
- 11 revitalization program; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Conrail has made a significant investment in
- 13 Pennsylvania during the past few years by expending hundreds of
- 14 millions of dollars on roadbed improvements and purchases or

- 1 rehabilitation of rolling stock; and
- 2 WHEREAS, The dissolution of Conrail may lead to a significant
- 3 disruption of rail service, a devaluation of capital investment,
- 4 a devastating loss of jobs, a detrimental impact on related
- 5 industries and may deal a severe blow to efforts toward economic
- 6 recovery and development in the Commonwealth as well as the
- 7 entire Northeast Region of the United States; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The members of the General Assembly of Pennsylvania
- 9 join with Federal Government administrators, officials of the
- 10 major rail companies, members of Congress and officials from
- 11 other states in the Northeast in recognizing that the Federal
- 12 Government cannot support Conrail indefinitely and that many
- 13 significant changes must be made in the present Conrail system
- 14 if it is to become a viable, profitable and efficient entity;
- 15 and
- 16 WHEREAS, Members of the General Assembly support proposals
- 17 that permit Conrail to discontinue commuter services, to reduce
- 18 its current physical plant and to revise elements of Federal
- 19 legislation concerning Conrail employees; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Because of the lack of detail in the plans recently
- 21 released by the Federal Government it would be premature to
- 22 dismiss the option of preserving Conrail; therefore be it
- 23 RESOLVED (the Senate concurring), That the General Assembly
- 24 of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania memorialize President Ronald
- 25 Reagan, members of Congress and more specifically the members of
- 26 the Pennsylvania Delegation, officials of the Federal Railway
- 27 Administration and the United States Department of
- 28 Transportation to permit Conrail to make an orderly transition
- 29 from Federal support to a nonsubsidized, efficient and
- 30 competitive entity; and be it further

- 1 RESOLVED, That the members of the Pennsylvania General
- 2 Assembly implore Federal administrators, union officials,
- 3 members of Congress and Conrail management to secure timely
- 4 agreement on the changes necessary to fulfill these expressed
- 5 goals and to restore the confidence of the citizens of this
- 6 Nation.
