11	§ 1345. SPECIAL PLATES FOR RECIPIENTS OF THE MEDAL OF HONOR.	
12	UPON APPLICATION OF ANY PERSON WHO IS A RECIPIENT OF THE	
13	MEDAL OF HONOR, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ISSUE TO SUCH PERSON A	
14	SPECIAL REGISTRATION PLATE DESIGNATING THE VEHICLE SO LICENSED	
15	AS BELONGING TO A PERSON WHO IS A RECIPIENT OF THE MEDAL OF	
16	HONOR. THE PLATE SHALL HAVE A LIGHT BLUE BACKGROUND INTERSPERSED	
17	WITH 13 WHITE STARS. THE CENTER OF THE PLATE SHALL BEAR A GOLDEN	
18	BRONZE REPLICA OF THE APPROPRIATE MEDAL. THE INITIALS OF EACH	

1	RECIPIENT SHALL BE EMBOSSED IN RED TO THE LEFT OF THE MEDAL AND
2	THE LETTERS "CMH" (FOR CONGRESSIONAL MEDAL OF HONOR) SHALL BE
