AN ACT

1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
2 Statutes, further defining "emergency vehicle."

3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
4 hereby enacts as follows:

5 Section 1. The definition of "emergency vehicle" in section
6 102 of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is
7 amended to read:

8 § 102. Definitions.

9 Subject to additional definitions contained in subsequent
10 provisions of this title which are applicable to specific
11 provisions of this title, the following words and phrases when
12 used in this title shall have, unless the context clearly
13 indicates otherwise, the meanings given to them in this section:

14 * * *

15 "Emergency vehicle." [A fire department vehicle, police
16 vehicle, ambulance, blood-delivery vehicle, armed forces
17 emergency vehicle, one vehicle operated by a coroner or chief

1 county medical examiner and one vehicle operated by a chief
2 deputy coroner or deputy chief county medical examiner used for
3 answering emergency calls, one private vehicle of a fire or
4 police chief or assistant chief or, when a fire company has
5 three or more fire vehicles, a second assistant chief, or fire
6 police captain and fire police lieutenant or ambulance corps
7 commander or assistant commander or of a river rescue commander
8 or emergency management coordinator or fire marshal used for
9 answering emergency calls or other vehicle designated by the
10 State Police under section 6106 (relating to designation of
11 emergency vehicles by Pennsylvania State Police).] Any of the
12 following:

13 (1) A vehicle designated by the State Police under
14 section 6106 (relating to designation of emergency vehicles
15 by Pennsylvania State Police).

16 (2) One vehicle operated by a coroner or chief county
17 medical examiner used for answering emergency calls.

18 (3) One vehicle operated by a chief deputy coroner or
19 deputy chief county medical examiner used for answering
20 emergency calls.

21 (4) One private vehicle, used for answering emergency
22 calls, of any of the following individuals:

23 (i) A fire chief.

24 (ii) An assistant fire chief or, when a fire company
25 has three or more fire vehicles, a second assistant
26 chief.

27 (iii) A police chief.

28 (iv) An assistant police chief.

29 (v) A fire police captain.

30 (vi) A fire police lieutenant.

1 (vii) An ambulance corps commander or assistant
2 commander.

3 (viii) A river rescue commander.

4 (ix) An emergency management coordinator.

5 (x) A fire marshal.

6 (5) A fire department vehicle.

7 (6) A police vehicle.

8 (7) An ambulance.

9 (8) A blood-delivery vehicle.

10 (9) An armed forces emergency vehicle.

12 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
