AN ACT

1 Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled
2 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the
3 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the
4 Executive Department thereof and the administrative
5 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof,
6 including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or
7 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or
8 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative
9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and
10 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative
11 officers, and of the several administrative departments,
12 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the
13 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive
14 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of
15 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and
16 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards,
17 and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the
18 number and compensation of the deputies and all other
19 assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and
20 commissions shall be determined," further providing for the
21 awarding of certain contracts open to public bidding.

22 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
23 hereby enacts as follows:

24 Section 1. Section 523 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177,
25 No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, added June 1,
26 1931 (P.L.350, No.144), is amended to read:

27 Section 523. Reciprocal Limitations upon the Purchase of

1 Supplies, Services and Materials.--It shall be unlawful for any
2 administrative department, board, agency, authority or
3 commission to specify for or permit to be used in or on any
4 public building or other work erected, constructed, or repaired
5 at the expense of the Commonwealth, or to purchase, any
6 services, supplies, equipment, or materials furnished or
7 manufactured in any state or municipality of such state which
8 prohibits the specification for or use in or on its public
9 buildings or other works or the purchase of services, supplies,
10 equipment, or materials not furnished or manufactured in such
11 state or municipality of such state.

12 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
