AN ACT

- 1 Providing reimbursement by insurance companies, professional 2 health service plan corporations, fraternal benefit societies
- and voluntary nonprofit health service plans for services
- 4 performed by a registered nurse.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Policies, contracts or certificates covered.
- 8 (a) Coverage enumerated. -- This act shall apply to every
- 9 group or individual policy, contract or certificate issued
- 10 thereunder, of health, sickness or accident insurance delivered
- 11 or issued for delivery within the Commonwealth including, but
- 12 not limited to, policies, contracts or certificates issued by:
- 13 (1) Any stock insurance company as defined in section
- 14 202(c)(4) and (11) and any mutual insurance company as
- defined in section 202(d)(1) of the act of May 17, 1921
- 16 (P.L.682, No.284), known as The Insurance Company Law of
- 17 1921.

- 1 (2) Any hospital plan corporation as defined in 40
- 2 Pa.C.S. Ch. 61 (relating to hospital plan corporations).
- 3 (3) Any professional health services plan corporation as
- 4 defined in 40 Pa.C.S. Ch. 63 (relating to professional health
- 5 services plan corporations).
- 6 (4) Any fraternal benefit society as defined in 40
- 7 Pa.C.S. Ch. 65 (relating to fraternal benefit societies).
- 8 (5) Any voluntary nonprofit health service plan as
- 9 defined in the act of December 29, 1972 (P.L.1701, No.364),
- 10 known as the Health Maintenance Organization Act.
- 11 (6) Any person who sells or issues contracts or
- certificates of insurance which meet the requirements of this
- 13 act.
- 14 (b) Application to policies, etc.--This act shall apply to
- 15 policies, contracts or certificates issued, renewed, modified,
- 16 altered, amended or reissued on or after the effective date of
- 17 this act.
- 18 Section 2. Scope of coverage.
- 19 Whenever a policy, contract or certificate provides for
- 20 reimbursement for any service which is within the scope of
- 21 practice for which registered professional nurses are licensed
- 22 pursuant to the act of May 22, 1951 (P.L.317, No.69), known as
- 23 The Professional Nursing Law, the insured or any other person
- 24 covered by the policy, contract or certificate shall be entitled
- 25 to reimbursement either directly to the insured or to the
- 26 provider of the service, when the service is performed by a
- 27 registered nurse permitted by law to perform that service. When
- 28 services may legally be performed by a licensed registered
- 29 professional nurse, without the intervention, supervision,
- 30 prescription or order of a physician, reimbursement for the

- 1 services may not be conditioned upon the intervention,
- 2 supervision, prescription or order of a physician.
- 3 Section 3. Rules and regulations.
- 4 The Insurance Commissioner shall promulgate such rules and
- 5 regulations as are deemed necessary for the effective
- 6 implementation and operation of this act. Public hearings shall
- 7 be held prior to the promulgation of any regulations, including
- 8 a verbatim transcript and cross-examination of all witnesses in
- 9 accordance with applicable rules of procedure, unless the
- 10 regulation or amendment is insubstantial.
- 11 Section 4. Construction of act.
- 12 This act shall not apply to in-hospital nursing care and
- 13 shall not be construed to affect or impair hospital procedures
- 14 for billing for in-hospital nursing care.
- 15 Section 5. Effective date.
- 16 This act shall take effect in 90 days.
