AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled "An act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and 2 3 brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and 5 restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession, consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding 6 7 in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic 8 liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the 9 persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and 10 duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing 11 for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores, 12 for the payment of certain license fees to the respective 13 municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain 14 nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure 15 without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures; providing for local option, and repealing existing laws," requiring silent alarms to be installed in Pennsylvania 16 17 18 Liquor Stores. - hereby enacts as follows: 20
- 21 Section 1. The act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), known
- 22 as the Liquor Code, is amended by adding a section to read:
- 23 Section 301.1. Silent Alarm. -- Every Pennsylvania Liquor
- Store shall have installed a silent alarm system which when 24
- activated would alert the local police. 25

1 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
