19	ENTITIES ENUMERATED IN THIS ACT AND ON BEHALF OF ALL OFFICERS			
20	AND EMPLOYES THEREOF, SOCIAL SECURITY OVERPAYMENTS MADE TO THE

22	(C) THE EXPENSES INCURRED BY THE STATE TREASURER IN			
23	RECOVERING SUCH OVERPAYMENTS MAY BE PAID OUT OF ANY RECOVERIES			
24	OF OVERPAYMENTS ON BEHALF OF THE COMMONWEALTH AND SCHOOL			
25	DISTRICTS ENTITIES.	<		
26	(D) THE STATE TREASURER MAY TAKE SUCH ACTIONS AS HE DEEMS			
27	REASONABLE IN THE RECOVERY OF SUCH OVERPAYMENTS.			
28	(E) THE FULL AMOUNT OF ANY RECOVERIES OF OVERPAYMENTS FOR			
29	EMPLOYES SHALL BE REFUNDED TO SUCH EMPLOYES. THE AMOUNT OF ANY
