AN ACT

1 Requiring the superintendent of every public school district to
2 make available, upon request, lists of graduating seniors to
3 armed forces recruiters; and providing a penalty for the
4 misuse of any such lists.

5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6 hereby enacts as follows:

7 Section 1. Legislative intent.

8 It is the intent of the General Assembly through this
9 legislation to assist armed forces recruiters to achieve
10 additional access to potential recruits by compiling a list of
11 prospective graduating seniors for distribution, upon written
12 request, to armed forces recruiters for the cost thereof, for
13 recruiting purposes only.

14 Section 2. List of seniors to be compiled.

15 (a) Lists.--Subject to the limitations of subsection (b),
16 the superintendent of every public school district shall compile
17 a list of senior students, both male and female, including home
18 address and published telephone number who at the end of the

1 respective academic year will graduate from the school system.
2 The list shall be compiled within 45 calendar days of the
3 effective date of this act and in succeeding years by the first
4 day of the academic year in which the senior students will
5 graduate.

6 (b) Notification.--Each school district shall notify the
7 students in writing prior to the end of their junior year of the
8 requirements imposed by subsection (a). Each student shall be
9 given at least 21 calendar days to request in writing to the
10 superintendent exclusion of such student's name prior to the
11 release of such list.

12 Section 3. List to be made available.

13 The list shall be made available to armed forces recruiters
14 for the active component, the reserve component or the National
15 Guard component of the armed forces.

16 Section 4. Penalties.

17 Any person who violates any section of this act, commits a
18 summary offense and, upon conviction thereof, shall pay a fine
19 of \$100. Each day that any person violates this act shall
20 constitute a separate offense.

21 Section 5. Effective date.

22 This act shall take effect immediately.
