## AN ACT

- Amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), entitled 2 "An act concerning elections, including general, municipal, special and primary elections, the nomination of candidates, 3 4 primary and election expenses and election contests; creating 5 and defining membership of county boards of elections; imposing duties upon the Secretary of the Commonwealth, 6 7 courts, county boards of elections, county commissioners; imposing penalties for violation of the act, and codifying, 8 revising and consolidating the laws relating thereto; and 9 10 repealing certain acts and parts of acts relating to elections," requiring candidates to be registered and 11 enrolled as a member of a political party. 12
- 13 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 14 hereby enacts as follows:
- 15 Section 1. Section 910 of the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333,
- 16 No.320), known as the Pennsylvania Election Code, amended July
- 17 11, 1980 (P.L.591, No.127), is amended to read:
- 18 Section 910. Affidavits of Candidates.--Each candidate for
- 19 any State, county, city, borough, incorporated town, township,
- 20 ward, school district, poor district, election district, party
- 21 office, party delegate or alternate, or for the office of United

- 1 States Senator or Representative in Congress, shall file with
- 2 his nomination petition his affidavit stating--(a) his
- 3 residence, with street and number, if any, and his post-office
- 4 address; (b) his election district, giving city, borough, town
- 5 or township; (c) the name of the office for which he consents to
- 6 be a candidate; (d) that he is eligible for such office; (e)
- 7 that he will not knowingly violate any provision of this act, or
- 8 of any law regulating and limiting nomination and election
- 9 expenses and prohibiting corrupt practices in connection
- 10 therewith; (f) unless he is a candidate for judge of a court of
- 11 record, or for the office of school director in a district where
- 12 that office is elective or for the office of justice of the
- 13 peace that he is not a candidate for nomination for the same
- 14 office of any party other than the one designated in such
- 15 petition; (g) if he is a candidate for a delegate, or alternate
- 16 delegate, member of State committee, National committee or party
- 17 officer, that he is a registered and enrolled member of the
- 18 designated party; (h) if he is a candidate for delegate or
- 19 alternate delegate the presidential candidate to whom he is
- 20 committed or the term "uncommitted"; [and] (i) that he is aware
- 21 of the provisions of section 1626 of this act requiring pre-
- 22 election and post-election reporting of campaign contributions
- 23 and expenditures and (j) that he is registered and enrolled as a
- 24 member of a political party. In cases of petitions for delegate
- 25 and alternate delegate to National conventions, the candidate's
- 26 affidavit shall state that his signature to the delegate's
- 27 statement, as hereinafter set forth, if such statement is signed
- 28 by said candidate, was affixed to the sheet or sheets of said
- 29 petition prior to the circulation of same. In the case of a
- 30 candidate for nomination as President of the United States, it

- 1 shall not be necessary for such candidate to file the affidavit
- 2 required in this section to be filed by candidates, but the
- 3 post-office address of such candidate shall be stated in such
- 4 nomination petition.
- 5 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
