A RESOLUTION

1 Requesting that the Labor Relations Committee of the House of
2 Representatives be directed to investigate and study the
3 Department of Labor and Industry policy relating to job
4 retraining under the Unemployment Compensation Law.

5 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania has the second
6 highest unemployment rate among the ten most populous states;
7 and

8 WHEREAS, Many Pennsylvania residents are suffering as a
9 result of the high unemployment rate; and

10 WHEREAS, The interpretation of the Department of Labor and
11 Industry as to denial of benefits is contrary to section
12 ~~402(d)(1)~~ 401(D)(1) of the Unemployment Compensation Law; and <—

13 WHEREAS, The Department of Labor and Industry has been using
14 a restrictive policy with regard to unemployment compensation
15 availability for suitable work requirements, particularly in the
16 areas of job retraining and college attendance; therefore be it

17 RESOLVED, That the Labor Relations Committee of the House of

1 Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania be directed
2 to investigate and study the Department of Labor and Industry
3 policy relating to job retraining under the Unemployment
4 Compensation Law; and be it further

5 RESOLVED, That the Labor Relations Committee report its
6 findings to the General Assembly as soon as possible.
