A RESOLUTION

- 1 Providing for the appointment of a select committee to review
- 2 and investigate the Commonwealth's compliance with Act 93 of
- 3 1978.
- 4 WHEREAS, The General Assembly acknowledged the plight of the
- 5 migrant and seasonal farm worker in Pennsylvania by enacting the
- 6 act of June 23, 1978 (P.L.537, No.93), known as the Seasonal
- 7 Farm Labor Act, with the declared intent to "improve the
- 8 conditions of seasonal farm workers by establishing standards
- 9 for their wages, hours, conditions of work, housing, sanitation,
- 10 food facilities, fire protection and safety "; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The Congress and the President of the United States
- 12 enacted the Migrant and Seasonal Agricultural Worker Protection
- 13 Act (Public Law 97-470) on January 14, 1983, to improve and
- 14 expand existing Federal law; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The Federal Government, under the provisions of
- 16 Chapter I of the Education Consolidated Improvement Act,
- 17 provides \$1,883,483 to the Commonwealth for the education of
- 18 migrant and seasonal farm workers' children; and

- 1 WHEREAS, There is a need to review the Seasonal Farm Labor
- 2 Act to bring it into compliance with the new Federal law; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Litigation has been undertaken and questions have
- 4 been raised regarding the Commonwealth's implementation of the
- 5 Seasonal Farm Labor Act; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The education of migrant and seasonal farm workers!
- 7 children is an important and integral part of the services
- 8 provided by the Commonwealth; therefore be it
- 9 RESOLVED, That the Speaker of the House of Representatives
- 10 appoint a select committee of nine members: three members from
- 11 the Labor Relations Committee, three members from the
- 12 Agriculture and Rural Affairs Committee and three members from
- 13 the Education Committee, two members from the majority party and
- 14 one from the minority party to make a complete and thorough
- 15 review and investigation of the Commonwealth's compliance under
- 16 the act of June 23, 1978 (P.L.537, No.93), known as the Seasonal
- 17 Farm Labor Act, the Migrant and Seasonal Agricultural Worker
- 18 Protection Act (Public Law 97-470) and the Department of
- 19 Education's Migrant Education Program as funded by Chapter I of
- 20 the Education Consolidated Improvement Act; and be it further
- 21 RESOLVED, That the committee may hold hearings, take
- 22 testimony and make its investigations at such places as it deems
- 23 necessary within this Commonwealth; and be it further
- 24 RESOLVED, That the committee make a report of its findings
- 25 and recommendations to the House of Representatives as soon as
- 26 practicable.
