1 2 3	Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for limitations of prosecutions for certain criminal offenses.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Section 5551 of Title 42 of the Pennsylvania
7	Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
8	§ 5551. No limitation applicable [to murder or voluntary
9	manslaughter].
10	A prosecution for [murder or for voluntary manslaughter] the
11	following offenses may be commenced at any time:
12	(1) Murder.
13	(2) Voluntary manslaughter.
14	(3) Conspiracy to commit murder or solicitation to
15	commit murder if a murder results from the conspiracy or
16	solicitation.
17	(4) Any felony alleged to have been perpetrated in
18	connection with a murder of the FIRST OR second degree, as

- 6 (a) General rule. -- Except as otherwise provided in this
- 7 subchapter, a prosecution for an offense [other than murder or

- 11 offenses must be commenced within five years after it is
