AN ACT

1 To provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the  
2 Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the  
3 Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for  
4 the fiscal year July 1, 1984 to June 30, 1985, and for the  
5 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close  
6 of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1984; to provide  
7 appropriations from the Lottery Fund to the Executive  
8 Department; and to provide for the appropriation of Federal  
9 funds to the Executive and Judicial Departments of the  
10 Commonwealth and for the establishment of restricted receipts  
11 accounts for the fiscal year July 1, 1984 to June 30, 1985  
12 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at  
13 the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1984.

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27 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
28 hereby enacts as follows:

29 PART I

30 GENERAL PROVISIONS

1       Section 101. Short title.--This act shall be known and may  
2 be cited as the General Appropriation Act of 1984.

3       Section 102. Definitions.--The following words and phrases  
4 when used in this act shall have the meanings given to them in  
5 this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

6       "Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau  
7 or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant  
8 superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists,  
9 engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries,  
10 auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians,  
11 marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and  
12 other assistants in any department, board or commission.

13       "Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding  
14 and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies,  
15 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and  
16 repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage, telephones and  
17 telegraph rentals and toll charges, newspaper advertising and  
18 notices, public advertising by or through any medium, fuel,  
19 light, heat, power and water, minor construction and renovation,  
20 repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and  
21 facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on  
22 workmen's compensation, insurance premiums on policies of  
23 liability insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment  
24 insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on  
25 employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee  
26 group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth  
27 share of social security taxes and unemployment compensation  
28 costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or  
29 additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental  
30 costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of

1 General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of  
2 automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned  
3 automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred  
4 through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall  
5 include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State  
6 institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside  
7 hospital: Provided, That in no case shall the State institution  
8 pay more for patient care than that provided under the State  
9 medical assistance program.

25 Section 104. State appropriations.--(a) General Fund.--The  
26 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may  
27 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the  
28 General Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the  
29 Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the  
30 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other



1 compensation and travel expense of the duly elected or appointed  
2 officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for payment of fees  
3 of contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of  
4 goods, services, printing, public advertising by or through any  
5 medium, equipment, land and buildings and for payment of any  
6 other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for  
7 the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and  
8 for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year  
9 beginning July 1, 1984 and for the payment of bills incurred and  
10 remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30,  
11 1984.

12 (b) Lottery Fund.--The following sums set forth in this act,  
13 or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically  
14 appropriated from the Lottery Fund to the several hereinafter  
15 named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth  
16 for the payment of fees of contractual services rendered, for  
17 the purchase or rental of goods, services and for payment of any  
18 other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for  
19 the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and  
20 for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year  
21 beginning July 1, 1984 and for the payment of bills incurred and  
22 remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30,  
23 1984.

24 Section 105. Federal augmentation appropriations.--The  
25 following Federal augmentation appropriations set forth in this  
26 act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby  
27 specifically appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to  
28 the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive and  
29 Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of the  
30 expenses of implementing and carrying out the programs stated

1 herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1984 and for the  
2 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of  
3 the fiscal year ending June 30, 1984. Unless otherwise stated,  
4 the appropriations include any carryovers from the prior fiscal  
5 year.

6 Section 106. Job Training Partnership Act appropriations.--  
7 The following sums as set forth in this act, or as much thereof  
8 as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the Job  
9 Training Partnership Act (JTPA) funds to the several hereinafter  
10 named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth  
11 for the payment of the expenses of implementing and carrying out  
12 the program stated herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
13 1984.

14 Section 107. Jobs Stimulus Bill appropriations.--The  
15 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may  
16 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from funds  
17 available from the Federal Jobs Stimulus Bill (Public Law 98-8)  
18 to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive  
19 Department of the Commonwealth for the purposes, and under the  
20 restrictions, for which the funds are provided for the fiscal  
21 year beginning July 1, 1984.

22 Section 108. Block grants.--(a) Appropriation.--The  
23 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may  
24 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the  
25 block grant (BG) funds to the several hereinafter named agencies  
26 of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the  
27 purposes, and under the restrictions, for which the funds are  
28 provided for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1984.

29 (b) Small Communities Development Block Grant.--The Small  
30 Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small

1 cities and communities that have a high concentration of  
2 impoverished citizens and substandard housing to expand their  
3 low and moderate income housing opportunities and to meet  
4 community development needs.

5 (c) Community Services Block Grant.--The Community Services  
6 Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and  
7 activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on  
8 the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the  
9 community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In  
10 addition, new focus may be placed on the unemployed, both old  
11 and new. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements  
12 for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to  
13 assure proper consideration of each recipient.

14 (d) Education Consolidation and Improvement Block Grant.--  
15 The Education Consolidation and Improvement Block Grant (ECIBG)  
16 will be used for the administration and provision of education  
17 programs in accordance with the requirements of the Omnibus  
18 Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981:

19 (e) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant.--The  
20 Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is  
21 for the provision of preventive health and other health services  
22 related to emergency medical comprehensive public health,  
23 hypertension, fluoridation, health education, risk reduction,  
24 home health, rape crisis and rodent control.

25 (f) Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant.--The  
26 Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to  
27 assure mothers and children access to quality maternal and child  
28 health services, to reduce infant mortality and the incidence of  
29 preventable disease and handicapping condition among children,  
30 provide rehabilitative services for blind and disabled

1 individuals under the age of 16 receiving supplemental security  
2 income benefits; and providing medical services for children  
3 with crippling conditions.

4 (g) Alcohol and Drug Abuse and Mental Health Services Block  
5 Grant.--The Alcohol and Drug Abuse and Mental Health Services  
6 Block Grant (ADAMHSBG) will be used for the administration and  
7 provision of drug and alcohol abuse services and community  
8 mental health services in accordance with the requirements of  
9 the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981.

10 (h) Low-Income Energy Assistance Block Grant.--The Low-  
11 Income Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIEABG) is to help lessen  
12 the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income families and  
13 individuals.

14 (i) Social Services Block Grant.--The Social Services Block  
15 Grant (SSBG) is for the provision of social services to eligible  
16 persons.

17 Section 109. Oil Overcharge Settlement appropriations.--(a)  
18 Source of funds.--In accordance with settlements of litigation  
19 brought by the United States Department of Energy against oil  
20 companies and refineries for alleged violations of the Federal  
21 petroleum price allocation regulations and the Further  
22 Continuing Appropriations Act of 1983, adopted by Congress in  
23 December, 1982 (House Joint Resolution 631), \$5,500,000 will be  
24 available to the Commonwealth for specific energy conservation  
25 programs through the fiscal year ending June 30, 1985.

26 (b) Appropriations.--The following sums set forth in this  
27 act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby  
28 specifically appropriated from the restricted receipt account,  
29 Oil Overcharge Settlements (OOS), to the several hereinafter  
30 named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth

1 for the payment of the expenses of implementing and carrying out  
2 the program stated herein for the fiscal year July 1, 1984 to  
3 June 30, 1985.

RESTRICTED RECEIPT ACCOUNTS

8 local school districts and private nonprofit schools.

9 (3) "ECIA Title I - Exceptional and Educationally Deprived  
10 Children" - To provide special educational needs and related  
11 services for children in institutions for the neglected and  
12 delinquent children, to provide financial assistance to local  
13 educational agencies in areas with high concentrations of low-  
14 income children, to initiate, expand or improve the educational  
15 programs for the handicapped in approved private schools, State  
16 schools or institutions operated or supported by the  
17 Commonwealth and to provide migrant children with educational  
18 experiences and services related to the educational process.

19 (4) "Education of the Handicapped Act - Title VI - To  
20 establish a family center demonstration program for preschool  
21 handicapped children and disseminate techniques developed; to  
22 develop a comprehensive plan for the education of the preschool  
23 handicapped; and to develop and operate resource centers.

24 (5) "Adult Basic Education - Federal Grants" - To encourage  
25 and expand basic education programs through 12th grade for  
26 adults 16 years and over.

27 (6) "Gifted and Talented" - To provide aid in the area of  
28 gifted and talented education to the intermediate units and  
29 school districts.

30 (7) "Education of the Handicapped Act" - To initiate,

1 expand, or improve educational programs for handicapped  
2 children.

3 (8) "Food Nutrition Service" - To initiate, maintain and  
4 expand nonprofit food services programs including the school  
5 breakfast program for children, through grants-in-aid and the  
6 purchase of equipment.

7 (9) "Library Services and Construction Act - Library  
8 Construction" - For matching payments to local libraries and for  
9 expanding library services.

10 (10) "Higher Education Act of 1965 - Community Services  
11 Program" - For grants to universities assisting university  
12 communities in alleviating problems.

13 (11) "Handicapped Personnel Preparation" - To carry out a  
14 program of personnel preparation designed to produce  
15 competencies in educators supporting handicapped children.

16 (12) "Career Education Incentive Act" - To provide funds to  
17 local school districts for the purpose of developing and  
18 implementing comprehensive career education programs in grades  
19 kindergarten through 12.

20 (13) "Higher Education Facilities (VII)" - For  
21 reconstruction and renovation grants to higher educational  
22 institutions to remove architectural barriers to the  
23 handicapped.

24 (14) "Basic Skills Improvement" - To provide funding for the  
25 development and implementation of comprehensive programs to  
26 improve basic skills proficiency and instruction.

27 (15) "Penn State University Federal Aid" - For payment of  
28 Federal aid to land-grant colleges.

29 (16) "Transition Program for Refugee Children" - To provide  
30 special educational services to eligible refugee children.

1       Section 406. Department of Environmental Resources.--The  
2 following restricted receipt accounts may be established for the  
3 Department of Environmental Resources:

4       (1) "Federal Water Resources Planning Act" - To be used for  
5 conservation, development and utilization of water and related  
6 land resources including, but not limited to, development of a  
7 State Water Plan, increasing State participation in such  
8 planning and participation in river basin commissions.

9       (2) "Federal Aid to Volunteer Fire Companies" - For deposit  
10 of Federal funds received in accordance with Title IV of the  
11 Rural Development Act of 1972.

12       (3) "Federal Land and Water Conservation Fund Act" - For  
13 deposit of Federal funds received from the Heritage Conservation  
14 and Recreation Services for outdoor recreation.

15       (4) "National Forest Reserve Allotment" - For payment of  
16 funds to those counties in which National Forests are located.

17       (5) "Flood Control Payments" - To be used to defray county  
18 expenses.

19       (6) "Federal Land and Water Conservation Fund Act -  
20 Environmental Resources."

21       (7) "Soil and Water Conservation Act - Inventory of  
22 Programs" - To provide assistance through the states, to local  
23 soil and water conservation districts to develop an inventory of  
24 long-term soil and water resources programs conducted under the  
25 United States Department of Agriculture.

26       (8) "Reimbursement for Flood Related Costs" - To restore and  
27 replace damaged department facilities such as forestry roads and  
28 bridges, State parks facilities, flood protection projects and  
29 streams damaged as a result of the Agnes Flood of 1972.

30       (9) "Reimbursement for 1976 Flood Related Costs" - To

1 restore and replace damaged department facilities as a result of  
2 the Flood of 1976.

3 Section 407. Department of Transportation.--The following  
4 restricted receipt accounts may be established for the  
5 Department of Transportation:

6 (1) "Capital Assistance Elderly and Handicapped Programs."

7 (2) "Railroad Rehabilitation and Improvement Assistance."

8 (3) "Ridesharing/Van Pool Program - Acquisition."

9 Section 408. Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency.--The  
10 following restricted receipt accounts may be established for the  
11 Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency:

12 (1) "Receipts from Federal Government - Contributions for  
13 Civil Defense Supplies, Equipment and Facilities" - For Federal  
14 reimbursement for equipment, supplies and facilities.

15 (2) "Receipts from Federal Government - Contributions for  
16 Civil Defense Personnel and Administrative Expenses" - For  
17 payment of salaries, benefits and administrative expenses and  
18 travel of authorized State and local defense employees.

19 (3) "Receipts from Federal Government - Civil Defense -  
20 Disaster Relief Assistance to State and Political Subdivision" -  
21 For assistance to State and local governments and to selected  
22 private nonprofit facilities in alleviating emergencies arising  
23 from major disasters.

24 Section 409. Pennsylvania Historical and Museum  
25 Commission.--The following restricted receipt accounts may be  
26 established for the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum  
27 Commission:

28 (1) "Federal Grant - Historical Preservation Act of 1966" -  
29 For deposit and disbursement of Federal funds per regulations of  
30 the Historical Preservation Act of 1966.

PART V

SPECIAL PROVISIONS FOR FEDERAL FUNDS

Section 501. General Fund repository for Federal funds.--All moneys received from the Federal Government as contributions or supplements to the departments or agencies of the Commonwealth or the programs herein provided shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund for the purpose of the respective appropriations.

Section 502. Limitation on encumbering or spending Federal funds.--Federal funds shall be encumbered or spent only to the extent that such funds are estimated as being available during the fiscal year of the Commonwealth.

Section 503. Appropriation of prior unspent Federal funds.--Any Federal money which has been previously appropriated by the General Assembly and authorized or allocated by the Federal Government but remains unspent from prior fiscal years, and will not be renewed for fiscal year 1984-1985, is hereby appropriated. No funds from any Federal appropriation shall be used to fund the activities of the Human Resources Committee of the Cabinet.

Section 504. Subgrants between Federal fund appropriations.--With the exception of Federal money received under JTPA and SSBG, subgrants may be made between appropriations without further approval of the General Assembly. No subgrants shall be made to the Human Resources Committee of the Cabinet. The Secretary of the Budget shall submit a list of subgrants to the Chairmen of the House and Senate Appropriations Committees quarterly. No subgrant to a State agency, however, may be made from a restricted receipt without a specific appropriation by the General Assembly.

10 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

11 Section 701. Prior laws unaffected.--This act is not  
12 intended to be inconsistent with or to repeal any provision of  
13 any act enacted at this or any prior session of the General  
14 Assembly regulating the purchase of supplies, the ordering of  
15 printing and binding, the purchase, maintenance and use of  
16 automobiles, the method of making payments from the State  
17 Treasury for any purpose or the functioning of any  
18 administrative department, board or commission.

19 Section 702. Compliance with other law before funds  
20 available.--No appropriation made by this act to any department,  
21 board, commission or agency of the Executive Department shall be  
22 available unless and until the department, board, commission or  
23 agency has complied with sections 615 and 616 of the act of  
24 April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative  
25 Code of 1929.

26 Section 703. Contracts prerequisite to encumbering or  
27 committing funds.--Funds for the purchase of supplies, materials  
28 and equipment shall not be deemed to be committed or encumbered  
29 until contracts covering the purchase have been entered into  
30 with the vendors.

1       Section 704. Minority business set asides.--(a) Each  
2 department or other instrumentality of the Commonwealth listed  
3 in Subpart A of Part II, authorized to contract for buildings,  
4 highways, commodities, equipment, supplies or services, shall  
5 report to the General Assembly all information pertinent to  
6 anticipated procurement needs at the beginning of each fiscal  
7 year and each fiscal quarter thereafter.

8       (b) As used in this section the term "minority business"  
9 means a minority business enterprise as defined in the act of  
10 July 22, 1974 (P.L.598, No.206), known as the Pennsylvania  
11 Minority Business Development Authority Act.

12       Section 705. Appropriation of funds from miscellaneous  
13 sources.--(a) In addition to the amounts appropriated by this  
14 act, moneys received in payment for food and household supplies  
15 furnished to employees and other persons, except inmates, by an  
16 institution, and moneys received from the proceeds from the sale  
17 of any products of the soil, meats, livestock, timber or other  
18 materials sold by the department, shall be paid into the General  
19 Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund to the  
20 several respective institutions for the operation and  
21 maintenance of the institutions.

22       (b) In addition to the amounts appropriated by this act, all  
23 moneys received from any other source, except the Federal  
24 Government, as contributions for the programs provided herein,  
25 or as payment for services or materials furnished by one  
26 institution to another, except those collections designated as  
27 revenues, shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby  
28 appropriated out of the General Fund for the purposes of the  
29 respective appropriations.

30       (c) In addition to any funds specifically appropriated by

1 this act, all moneys received by a department or agency of the  
2 Commonwealth from any other sources, except the Federal  
3 Government, as contributions or supplements to the department or  
4 agency for a program or administration of an act included in  
5 this act shall be paid into the General Fund and credited to the  
6 appropriation for that program or administration of the act.

7 Section 706. Lapsing of unused funds.--(a) Except as  
8 provided in subsections (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g) and (h),  
9 that part of all appropriations in Part II unexpended,  
10 uncommitted or unencumbered as of June 30, 1985 shall  
11 automatically lapse as of that date.

12 (b) The appropriation in Part II to the Crime Victims  
13 Compensation Board for payment of claims shall be a continuing  
14 appropriation.

15 (c) The appropriations in Part II to the Department of  
16 Commerce for the various ports shall be a continuing  
17 appropriation.

18 (d) The appropriations in Part II to the Department of  
19 Community Affairs for housing and redevelopment assistance and  
20 enterprise development shall be a two-year continuing  
21 appropriation.

22 (e) The appropriations in Part II to the Department of  
23 Environmental Resources for the Chesapeake Bay Pollution  
24 Abatement Program and hazardous waste control shall be  
25 continuing appropriations.

26 (f) The appropriation in Part II to the Department of  
27 General Services for tort claims shall be a continuing  
28 appropriation.

29 (g) The appropriations in Part II to the Legislative  
30 Department shall be continuing appropriations.

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PART VIII

EFFECTIVE DATE

Section 801. Effective date.--(a) Except as provided in subsection (b), this act shall take effect July 1, 1984 or, if enacted subsequent to that date, then immediately.

(b) Part VI of this act relating to deficiencies shall take effect immediately.
