2 ~~act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public~~  
3 ~~welfare laws of the Commonwealth," providing for an increase~~  
4 ~~in individual ceilings for allowable net operating costs for~~  
5 ~~intermediate care facilities; and making appropriations.~~  
6 TO PROVIDE SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS FROM THE GENERAL FUND FOR <—  
7 THE EXPENSES OF THE EXECUTIVE AND JUDICIAL DEPARTMENTS OF THE  
8 COMMONWEALTH, THE PUBLIC DEBT, FOR ALLOWABLE NET OPERATING  
9 COSTS FOR INTERMEDIATE CARE FACILITIES AND FOR THE PUBLIC  
10 SCHOOLS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 1983 TO JUNE 30, 1984,  
11 AND FOR THE BILLS INCURRED AND REMAINING UNPAID AT THE CLOSE  
12 OF THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1983; AND TO FURTHER  
13 APPROPRIATE THE FEDERAL AUGMENTATION TO THE EXECUTIVE  
14 DEPARTMENT OF THE COMMONWEALTH FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1,  
15 1983 TO JUNE 30, 1984, FOR ALLOWABLE NET OPERATING COSTS FOR  
16 INTERMEDIATE CARE FACILITIES AND FOR THE PAYMENT OF BILLS  
17 INCURRED AND REMAINING UNPAID AT THE CLOSE OF THE FISCAL YEAR  
18 ENDING JUNE 30, 1983.

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10 SECTION 503. EFFECTIVE DATE.

11 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
12 hereby enacts as follows:

13 ~~Section 1. Section 443.1 of the act of June 13, 1967~~ <—  
14 ~~(P.L.31, No.21), known as the Public Welfare Code, is amended by~~  
15 ~~adding a clause to read:~~

16 ~~Section 443.1. Medical Assistance Payments for Institutional~~  
17 ~~Care. The following medical assistance payments shall be made~~  
18 ~~in behalf of eligible persons whose institutional care is~~  
19 ~~prescribed by physicians:~~

21 ~~(5) Individual ceilings for allowable net operating per diem~~  
22 ~~costs established for the various intermediate care facilities~~  
23 ~~for the fiscal year 1983 1984 shall be increased at a minimum by~~  
24 ~~six percent. The medical assistance net operating reimbursement~~  
25 ~~ceilings for the State fiscal year 1983 1984 should be computed~~  
26 ~~following the same methodology used for the 1982 1983 ceilings.~~  
27 ~~Necessary adjustments should be made in the geographic~~  
28 ~~groupings. The nursing staff allowance recognized for medical~~  
29 ~~assistance reimbursement shall be three and five tenths nursing~~  
30 ~~hours for skilled nursing facility services and three nursing~~

~~hours for intermediate care. It is the intent of the General Assembly that the increase is necessary to maintain appropriate care for patients whose services have been redefined by the department's regulations of January 8, 1983 pertaining to levels of care. Individual ceilings for the intermediate care facilities for the fiscal year 1983-1984 shall be increased a minimum of six percent from the ceilings in effect for the fiscal year 1982-1983.~~

~~Section 2. (a) The sum of \$7,800,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is specifically appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare for fiscal year July 1, 1983 to June 30, 1984 for medical assistance long term care facilities.~~

~~(b) The sum of \$9,929,000 is specifically appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare from the Federal augmentation funds to supplement the sum appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for long term care facilities for provision of services to patients in long term care facilities.~~

~~(c) The appropriations in subsections (a) and (b) shall be in addition to any sums appropriated in the act of July 11, 1983 (No.2A), known as the General Appropriation Act of 1983, and the act of July 21, 1983 (No.7A), known as the Supplemental General Appropriation Act for Fiscal Year 1983-1984.~~

~~Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.~~

## PART I

### GENERAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 101. SHORT TITLE.--THIS ACT SHALL BE KNOWN AND MAY BE CITED AS THE 1983-1984 THIRD SUPPLEMENTAL GENERAL APPROPRIATION ACT.

8 OTHER ASSISTANTS IN ANY DEPARTMENT, BOARD OR COMMISSION.

9 "EXPENSES" AND "MAINTENANCE." INCLUDES ALL PRINTING, BINDING  
10 AND STATIONERY, FOOD AND FORAGE, MATERIALS AND SUPPLIES,  
11 TRAVELING EXPENSES, TRAINING, MOTOR VEHICLE SUPPLIES AND  
12 REPAIRS, FREIGHT, EXPRESS AND CARTAGE, POSTAGE, TELEPHONES AND  
13 TELEGRAPH RENTALS AND TOLL CHARGES, NEWSPAPER ADVERTISING AND  
14 NOTICES, FUEL, LIGHT, HEAT, POWER AND WATER, MINOR CONSTRUCTION  
15 AND RENOVATION, REPAIRS OR RECONSTRUCTION OF EQUIPMENT,  
16 BUILDINGS AND FACILITIES, RENT OF REAL ESTATE AND EQUIPMENT,  
17 PREMIUMS ON WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION, INSURANCE PREMIUMS ON  
18 POLICIES OF LIABILITY INSURANCE, INSURANCE PREMIUMS ON MEDICAL  
19 PAYMENT INSURANCE AND SURETY BONDS FOR VOLUNTEER WORKERS,  
20 PREMIUMS ON EMPLOYEE GROUP LIFE INSURANCE AND EMPLOYEE AND  
21 RETIRED EMPLOYEE GROUP HOSPITAL AND MEDICAL INSURANCE, PAYMENT  
22 OF COMMONWEALTH SHARE OF SOCIAL SECURITY TAXES AND UNEMPLOYMENT  
23 COMPENSATION COSTS FOR STATE EMPLOYEES, THE PURCHASE OF  
24 REPLACEMENT OR ADDITIONAL EQUIPMENT AND MACHINERY AND ALL OTHER  
25 INCIDENTAL COSTS AND EXPENSES, INCLUDING PAYMENT TO THE  
26 DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES OF MILEAGE AND OTHER CHARGES FOR  
27 THE USE OF AUTOMOBILES AND RENTAL PAYMENTS FOR PERMANENTLY  
28 ASSIGNED AUTOMOBILES AND OF EXPENSES OR COSTS OF SERVICES  
29 INCURRED THROUGH THE PURCHASING FUND. THE TERM "EXPENSES" ALSO  
30 SHALL INCLUDE THE MEDICAL COSTS FOR THE TREATMENT OF INMATES OF

1 STATE INSTITUTIONS WHEN THE INMATE MUST BE TRANSFERRED TO AN  
2 OUTSIDE HOSPITAL: PROVIDED, THAT IN NO CASE SHALL THE STATE  
3 INSTITUTION PAY MORE FOR PATIENT CARE THAN THAT PROVIDED UNDER  
4 THE STATE MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

24 FOR THE PURPOSES HEREINAFTER SET FORTH FOR THE FISCAL YEAR  
25 BEGINNING JULY 1, 1983 AND FOR THE PAYMENT OF BILLS INCURRED AND  
26 REMAINING UNPAID AT THE CLOSE OF THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30,  
27 1983.

28 SECTION 202. FEDERAL AUGMENTATION APPROPRIATIONS.--THE
