A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 Expressing the opposition of the General Assembly to the
- 2 proposed closing of Dixmont State Hospital.
- 3 WHEREAS, The Department of Public Welfare proposes to close
- 4 Dixmont State Hospital and transfer its patients and employees;
- 5 and
- 6 WHEREAS, The determination by the Department of Public
- 7 Welfare intentionally ignores certain salient facts such as the
- 8 continuous accreditation of Dixmont, the ability to provide
- 9 certified handicapped care, recent renovations at the
- 10 institution at a cost of \$708,000 and the personal relationships
- 11 and quality of care furnished patients at Dixmont State
- 12 Hospital; and
- WHEREAS, When Dixmont is filled to capacity, it provides the
- 14 best care at the lowest cost per patient ratio of any
- 15 institution in that region of the Commonwealth; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The movement of the patients at Dixmont to other
- 17 institutions will generate serious stress situations and

- 1 emotional and economic upheaval; therefore be it
- 2 RESOLVED (the House of Representatives concurring), That the
- 3 General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania express its
- 4 strongest opposition to the closing of Dixmont State Hospital
- 5 and request the Department of Public Welfare to reconsider its
- 6 actions relative to Dixmont State Hospital; and be it further
- 7 RESOLVED, That before a State hospital is scheduled for
- 8 closing, and particularly the Dixmont State Hospital, the
- 9 Department of Public Welfare be urged to hold public hearings to
- 10 determine whether the closing would be in the best interests of
- 11 the Commonwealth and the community in which the State
- 12 institution is located; and be it further
- RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution, after passage, be
- 14 transmitted to the Governor and the Department of Public
- 15 Welfare.
