AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 1 2 act relating to the public school system, including certain 3 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 4 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the 5 laws relating thereto," PROVIDING FOR THE DEFINITION OF <-"PUPIL INSTRUCTION TIME"; AUTHORIZING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF 6 7 REGIONAL SUMMER ACADEMIES; further prohibiting the use of 8 standardized entrance aptitude tests as factors for the 9 admission of individuals having dyslexia; FURTHER PROVIDING FOR COURSES OF STUDY; MAKING AN EDITORIAL CHANGE; AND MAKING 10 11 AN APPROPRIATION.

12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

13 hereby enacts as follows:

14 Section 1. Section 1841 of the act of March 10, 1949

15 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949,

16 SECTION 1. THE ACT OF MARCH 10, 1949 (P.L.30, NO.14), KNOWN <

17 AS THE PUBLIC SCHOOL CODE OF 1949, IS AMENDED BY ADDING SECTIONS

18 TO READ:

19 <u>SECTION 1511.2.</u> DEFINITIONS.--WHEN USED IN THIS ARTICLE THE

20 FOLLOWING WORDS AND PHRASES SHALL HAVE THE FOLLOWING MEANINGS:

- 1 (1) "PUPIL INSTRUCTION TIME" MEANS TIME SPENT IN THE SCHOOL
- 2 PROGRAM AND RELATED ACTIVITIES.
- 3 (I) IN ADDITION TO THE PRESCRIBED COURSES AND INSTRUCTION,
- 4 <u>SUCH ACTIVITIES INCLUDE:</u>
- 5 (A) CLUBS WITH AN ACADEMIC ORIENTATION, STUDENT COUNCILS AND
- 6 <u>SIMILAR ACTIVITIES WHICH HAVE AN ACADEMIC BEARING.</u>
- 7 (B) SCHOOL, GROUP OR CLASS EDUCATIONAL TRIPS, IF ACCOMPANIED
 8 BY A CERTIFICATED SCHOOL EMPLOYE.
- 9 (C) FOR PUPILS IN GRADUATING CLASSES, NOT MORE THAN THREE
- 10 (3) DAYS FOR GRADUATION PREPARATION UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF
- 11 <u>CERTIFICATED SCHOOL EMPLOYES.</u>

12 (D) CIVIL DEFENSE, FIRE AND OTHER SIMILAR DRILLS.

- 13 (E) OPENING EXERCISES, HOMEROOM PERIODS AND SUPERVISED STUDY 14 HALLS.
- 15 (F) EARLY DISMISSAL AND DELAYED OPENING DUE TO INCLEMENT
- 16 <u>WEATHER.</u>
- 17 (II) PUPIL INSTRUCTION TIME SHALL NOT INCLUDE LUNCH PERIODS,

18 RECESS, EARLY DISMISSAL BEFORE A HOLIDAY, CELEBRATIONS, PICNICS,

19 HUNTING, FISHING, HARVESTING CROPS OR SIMILAR ACTIVITIES, AND

20 <u>TEACHERS MEETINGS, CONFERENCES, CONVENTIONS OR SIMILAR</u>

- 21 <u>ACTIVITIES.</u>
- 22 <u>SECTION 1547. REGIONAL SUMMER ACADEMIES. -- THE BOARD OF</u>

23 DIRECTORS OF EACH INTERMEDIATE UNIT IN THIS COMMONWEALTH SHALL

- 24 HAVE THE POWER TO ESTABLISH REGIONAL SUMMER ACADEMIES IN THE
- 25 SCIENCES, ARTS, SOCIAL SCIENCES AND HUMANITIES. ADMISSION TO THE
- 26 PROGRAM OFFERED BY REGIONAL SUMMER ACADEMIES SHALL BE OPEN ON A
- 27 <u>COMPETITIVE BASIS TO STUDENTS IN THE AREA SERVED BY THE</u>
- 28 INTERMEDIATE UNIT ACCORDING TO STANDARDS AND REGULATIONS
- 29 PROMULGATED BY THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION. THE INTERMEDIATE
- 30 UNIT MAY ESTABLISH A TUITION RATE OR RECEIVE FUNDS FROM OTHER

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1 SOURCES, IF NECESSARY, TO COVER ALL OR PART OF THE COSTS OF

2 OPERATING THE REGIONAL SUMMER ACADEMIES.

3 SECTION 2. SECTION 1605(A) OF THE ACT, AMENDED SEPTEMBER 20,
4 1961 (P.L.1530, NO.650), IS AMENDED TO READ:

5 SECTION 1605. COURSES OF STUDY.--(A) IN ALL PUBLIC, PRIVATE OR PAROCHIAL SCHOOLS, THERE SHALL BE INTEGRATED IN THE SOCIAL 6 7 STUDIES CURRICULUM COURSES OF STUDY AS PROVIDED IN THIS ACT. IT 8 SHALL BE THE DUTY OF THE SUPERINTENDENT HAVING SUPERVISION OVER 9 ANY HIGH SCHOOL TO PREPARE, AND RECOMMEND TO THE BOARD OF SCHOOL 10 DIRECTORS MAINTAINING THE SAME, SUITABLE COURSES OF STUDY, WHICH 11 SHALL BE ADOPTED BY SAID BOARD OF SCHOOL DIRECTORS, WITH SUCH CHANGES AS THEY MAY DEEM WISE, SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THIS 12 13 ACT. DURING GRADES SEVEN THROUGH TWELVE INCLUSIVE, THERE SHALL 14 BE INCLUDED AT LEAST FOUR SEMESTERS OR EQUIVALENT STUDY [IN] 15 SPECIFICALLY DEVOTED TO THE HISTORY AND GOVERNMENT OF THAT 16 PORTION OF AMERICA WHICH HAS BECOME THE UNITED STATES OF 17 AMERICA, AND OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, OF SUCH 18 NATURE, KIND OR QUALITY, AS TO HAVE FOR ITS PURPOSE THE 19 DEVELOPING, TEACHING AND PRESENTATION OF THE PRINCIPLES AND 20 IDEALS OF THE AMERICAN REPUBLICAN REPRESENTATIVE FORM OF 21 GOVERNMENT, AS PORTRAYED AND EXPERIENCED BY THE ACTS AND 22 POLICIES OF THE FRAMERS OF THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE AND 23 FRAMERS OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES AND THE BILL OF 24 RIGHTS. THE STUDY OF THE HISTORY OF THE UNITED STATES, INCLUDING 25 THE STUDY OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES AND THE STUDY 26 OF THE HISTORY AND CONSTITUTION OF THIS COMMONWEALTH, SHALL ALSO 27 BE SUCH AS WILL EMPHASIZE THE GOOD, WORTHWHILE AND BEST FEATURES 28 AND POINTS OF THE SOCIAL, ECONOMIC AND CULTURAL DEVELOPMENT, THE GROWTH OF THE AMERICAN FAMILY LIFE, HIGH STANDARD OF LIVING OF 29 30 THE UNITED STATES CITIZEN, THE PRIVILEGES ENJOYED BY SUCH - 3 -19850H0322B2834

CITIZENS, THEIR HERITAGE AND ITS DERIVATIONS OF AND IN OUR 1 PRINCIPLES OF GOVERNMENT. SUCH INSTRUCTION SHALL HAVE FOR ITS 2 3 PURPOSE ALSO THE INSTILLING INTO EVERY BOY AND GIRL WHO COMES 4 OUT OF OUR PUBLIC, PRIVATE AND PAROCHIAL SCHOOLS THEIR SOLEMN 5 DUTY AND OBLIGATION TO EXERCISE INTELLIGENTLY THEIR VOTING PRIVILEGE AND TO UNDERSTAND THE ADVANTAGES OF THE AMERICAN 6 7 REPUBLICAN FORM OF GOVERNMENT AS COMPARED WITH VARIOUS OTHER FORMS OF GOVERNMENT. 8

9 SUCH INSTRUCTION SHALL CONTINUE IN COURSES IN THE STATE
10 COLLEGES TO AN EXTENT TO BE DETERMINED BY THE [SUPERINTENDENT OF
11 PUBLIC INSTRUCTION] <u>SECRETARY OF EDUCATION</u>.

13 SECTION 3. SECTION 1841 OF THE ACT, amended December 6, 1972
14 (P.L.1417, No.308) and December 28, 1972 (P.L.1645, No.346), is
15 amended to read:

16 Section 1841. Area Vocational-Technical Schools and 17 Technical Institutes Authorized. -- An area vocational-technical 18 board may establish, maintain, conduct and operate schools, 19 departments or classes to prepare for vocational industrial, 20 vocational agricultural, vocational homemaking, business and 21 vocational distributive occupations, technical occupations, such 22 as aides and assistants, in physical, biological, space and 23 other sciences, mathematics, engineering, construction and 24 design, computer programming and maintenance, and health 25 occupations and for any other occupations requiring vocational 26 or technical training and education, to be known as "area 27 vocational-technical schools," for the education of pupils, out-28 of-school youth and adults residing in the attendance area. 29 Under no circumstances, however, shall any resident of this 30 Commonwealth who has been diagnosed as having dyslexia be

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required to take any WRITTEN standardized entrance aptitude test <--
 to gain admission to a program for adults operated by a school
 or institute as defined in section 1840.1. In lieu of SUCH <--
 standardized testing, dyslexic individuals shall undergo an oral
 examination procedure.

An area vocational-technical board or several area 6 vocational-technical boards jointly may provide for, establish, 7 maintain, conduct and operate schools, departments, or classes 8 to be known as "technical institute" to educate, train and offer 9 10 post high school programs and courses of not more than two 11 years' duration, which will prepare out-of-school youth and adults for competency in sub-professional, technical, health 12 13 service, business, commercial, merchandising and skilled 14 occupations and for any other occupations for which technical 15 training is helpful to an employer and increases students' 16 qualifications for employment. Technical institute programs and 17 courses shall be coordinated with those offered in area 18 vocational-technical schools to insure progressive advancement 19 of students. Such institutes shall be organized in accordance 20 with proposals of area vocational-technical boards of school 21 directors, which are approved by the State Board for Vocational 22 Education. All technical institutes shall be established, 23 operated and in all respects conform to standards prepared by the Department of Education and adopted by the State Board for 24 25 Vocational Education. Area vocational-technical schools, as 26 approved by the State Board for Vocational Education, may be organized as vocational-technical service centers in which 27 28 pupils may enroll full-time or in which pupils enrolled in 29 academic high schools may elect to attend part-time. Technical 30 institutes approved by the State Board for Vocational Education - 5 -19850H0322B2834

may enroll out-of-school youth and adults full-time or part-time
 as the students may elect.

Area vocational-technical school and technical institute attendance areas and standards for courses and equipment shall be in conformity with standards prepared by the Department of Education and approved by the State Board for Vocational Zeducation.

Section 2 4. Section 2006-A(a)(6) of the act, added November
12, 1982 (P.L.660, No.188), is amended to read:
Section 2006-A. Powers and Duties of the Board of
Governors.--(a) The Board of Governors shall have overall
responsibility for planning and coordinating the development and
operation of the system. The powers and duties of the Board of
Governors shall be:

16 (6) To establish general policies for the admission of students and to assure procedural protection for the discipline 17 18 and expulsion of students. The actual admission of students shall remain the province of the individual institutions. Under 19 20 no circumstances, however, shall any applicant who has been 21 diagnosed as having dyslexia be required to take any WRITTEN <-----22 standardized college entrance aptitude test to gain admission to 23 a system institution. In lieu of SUCH standardized testing, <---dyslexic individuals shall undergo an oral examination 24 25 procedure.

27 Section 3. This act shall take effect January 1, 1986.
28 SECTION 5. THE SUM OF \$1,000,000, OR AS MUCH THEREOF AS MAY
29 BE NECESSARY, IS HEREBY APPROPRIATED TO THE DEPARTMENT OF
30 EDUCATION IN ORDER TO CARRY OUT THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 1 OF
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1 THIS ACT RELATING TO REGIONAL SUMMER ACADEMIES UNDER SECTION 2 1547.

3 SECTION 6. SECTIONS 1 (INSOFAR AS IT RELATES TO SECTION 4 1547) AND 5 SHALL BE RETROACTIVE TO JANUARY 1, 1986.

5 SECTION 7. (A) SECTIONS 1 (INSOFAR AS IT RELATES TO SECTION 6 1511.2) AND 2 SHALL TAKE EFFECT JULY 1, 1986.

7 (B) THE REMAINDER OF THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY.
