AN ACT

1 Making appropriations to the Department of Community Affairs and
2 the Department of Environmental Resources for stream channel
3 work and public building repairs in relation to damages
4 caused by flood waters in certain counties.

5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6 hereby enacts as follows:

7 Section 1. Department of Community Affairs.

8 The sum of \$500,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary,
9 is hereby appropriated to the Department of Community Affairs
10 for the repair of schools and other public buildings, including
11 the replacement of equipment, damaged by the flood of 1985 in
12 the counties of Allegheny, Fayette, Greene, Lackawanna, Luzerne,
13 Washington and Westmoreland.

14 Section 2. Department of Environmental Resources.

15 The sum of \$5,000,000, or as much thereof as may be
16 necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Department of

1 Environmental Resources to restore stream channels damaged or
2 altered by the flood of 1985 in the counties of Allegheny,
3 Fayette, Greene, Lackawanna, Luzerne, Somerset, Susquehanna,
4 Washington, Wayne, Westmoreland and Wyoming.

5 Section 3. Lapse.

6 The funds appropriated by this act shall not lapse until July
7 1, 1987.

8 Section 4. Appropriations cumulative.

9 The funds appropriated by this act shall be in addition to
10 any other funds appropriated for the purposes stated in sections
11 1 and 2.

12 Section 5. Effective date.

13 This act shall take effect immediately.
