## AN ACT

Amending Title 30 (Fish) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for the registration of boats; imposing additional penalties for registration violations and actions by issuing agents; and granting the commission additional powers.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows:
Section 1. Sections 321, 5104, 5122, 5301, 5302, 5303, 5304, 5305, 5306, 5310 and 5311 of Title 30 of the Pennsylvania

Consolidated Statutes are amended to read:
§ 321. Administration and enforcement.
The commission shall administer and enforce this title and other laws of this Commonwealth relating to:
(1) The encouragement, promotion and development of the fishery interests.
(2) The protection, propagation and distribution of fish.
(3) The encouragement, promotion and development of
recreational boating.
[(3)] (4) The management of boating and the operation of boats.
§ 5104. Fees.
(a) General rule.--The following fees apply to
registrations, licenses, permits and capacity plates issued under this part and the fees collected shall be deposited in the State Treasury in the Boat Fund:
(1) Owner registration (boats less than 16 feet in
length), [\$4] \$6 per year.
(2) Owner registration (boats 16 feet or longer), \$6 per year.
(2.1) Owner registration (boats not equipped with
propelling machinery), $\$ 6$ per year.
(3) Duplicate owner registration, [\$1] \$3 each.
(4) Dealer registration, $\$ 15$ per year.
(5) Additional dealer registration, $\$ 5$ each.
(6) License for operator of passenger-carrying boat, \$5 each.
(7) Capacity plate, \$2 each.
[(8) Permit for special marine event, \$2 each.]
(b) Exemption.--A boat owned or operated by the Commonwealth shall be exempt from the owner registration fees of subsection (a) (1), (2) and (2.1). § 5122. Registrations, licenses, permits, plates and statistics.
(a) General rule.--The commission may promulgate rules and regulations relating to:
(1) Permanent and temporary registration of [motorboats] boats.
(2) Special provisions applicable to livery operators, dealers, manufacturers and the owners or operators of
passenger-carrying boats.
(3) Display of numbers.
(4) Renewal of certificates of registration.
(5) Transfer of ownership of or interest in boats or the abandonment or destruction of registered boats.
(6) Licensing of operators of passenger-carrying boats.
(7) Display of capacity plates by boats, the information to be displayed thereon and the issuance of capacity plates.
(8) Issuance of permits for special marine events.
(9) Compilation and release of statistics on accidents and registered boats.
(b) Penalty.--Any person who violates a rule or regulation promulgated under this section commits a summary offense of the third degree except that a person who operates a passengercarrying boat without a license commits a summary offense of the second degree.
§ 5301. Registration of [motorboats] boats required.
(a) General rule.--It is unlawful for any person to operate or navigate, or cause to be operated or navigated, any [motorboat] boat upon, over or through the waters of this Commonwealth unless the [motorboat] boat is registered in accordance with this chapter.
(b) Penalty.--Any person who violates this section commits a summary offense of the second degree.
§ 5302. Exemptions from registration.
[The registration requirements of this chapter do not apply to:]
(a) General rule.--The following classes of boats are exempt from the registration requirements of this chapter:
(1) Boats currently registered or awarded a number by
another state under a numbering system approved by Federal authority in which case the registration or number will be valid in this Commonwealth for a period of 60 days.
(2) Foreign boats temporarily using the waters of this Commonwealth.
(3) Boats, other than boats used for recreational purposes, which are:
(i) owned by the United States, a state or a subdivision thereof, except boats used for recreation;
(ii) used solely for public service functions such as search and rescue; and
(iii) clearly identifiable as such.

This paragraph includes boats owned by quasi-public organizations such as volunteer fire departments and river rescue units and used exclusively in the performance of their work in furthering safety and search and rescue on the water.
(4) Lifeboats on ships.
[(5) Boats possessing a valid marine document issued by the United States Coast Guard, or any Federal successor thereto, or by any foreign government.
(6) Boats not equipped with propelling machinery.]
(5) Boats less than seven feet in length not equipped with propelling machinery.
(6) Nonpowered boats used on an artificial pond constructed on a farm and holding water the source of which is wholly within the limits of the farm, operated by the owner or lessee of the farm, his family and other persons who are regularly employed upon the farm, all of the class of which must permanently reside upon the farm.
(b) Exemption by commission.--The commission may exempt any
to the commission within five days after receipt of each and every registration.
(e) Penalty.--Any issuing agent violating any of the provisions of this section commits a summary offense of the second degree and, in addition, may have his agency recalled at the discretion of the commission. § 5305. Application for registration.
(a) General rule.--Any person owning a [motorboat] boat and desiring to operate or navigate the [motorboat] boat, or cause it to be operated or navigated, on any inland or tidal waters of this Commonwealth shall make a written application to the commission or to a designated issuing agent for a registration for the [motorboat] boat.
(b) Form and content.--The application shall be made on a form prescribed, prepared and furnished by the commission and, together with such other information as the commission may require, shall state the name and address of the applicant and, if the applicant is a partnership, the names and addresses of all the partners, and, if the applicant is a corporation, the names and addresses of the officers.
(c) Penalty.--A person violating any of the provisions of this section commits a summary offense of the second degree. § 5306. Certificate of registration.
(a) Issuance.--Upon receipt of a signed application and upon the payment of the annual registration fee, the commission shall issue to the applicant owner a certificate of registration for his [motorboat] boat. The certificate of registration shall be pocket size.
(b) Carrying on [motorboat] boat.--The certificate of registration shall be available at all times for inspection on
the [motorboat] boat for which issued whenever the [motorboat] boat is in operation and shall be carried in such a manner that it can be handed to any Federal, State or local law enforcement officer authorized to inspect it. The commission may by regulation exempt certain classes of boats from this requirement or prescribe alternate compliance requirements.
(c) Retention on shore.--The certificate of registration for [motorboats] boats less than 26 feet long, leased or rented for noncommercial use of less than seven days, may be retained on shore by the owner of the [motorboat] boat or his representative at the place from which the [motorboat] boat departs or returns to the possession of the owner or his representative. A [motorboat] boat that does not have the certificate of registration on board shall be identifiable while in use and shall comply with all other requirements.
(d) Duplicates.--[Upon application of the owner on a form prescribed by the commission, the commission may issue the owner a duplicate registration certificate upon payment of the applicable fee.] The commission may issue a duplicate certificate of registration to the owner of a properly registered boat upon application by the owner on a form prescribed by the commission and with payment of the applicable fee.
(e) Penalty.--Any person operating a properly registered [motorboat] boat who does not have available for inspection on the [motorboat] boat, or refuses or fails to hand to any officer, the certificate of registration commits a summary offense of the third degree.
§ 5310. Display of registration number.
(a) General rule.--The registration number shown on the
certificate of registration shall be painted on or attached to each side of the bow of the [motorboat] boat in order that it may be clearly visible. No other number may be displayed on the bow. The number shall be maintained in a legible condition.
(b) Exceptions.--The provisions of subsection (a) do not
apply to:
(1) Boats possessing a valid marine document issued by the United States Coast Guard or any Federal successor thereto.
(2) Any other boat or class of boats on which the commission determines the display of the number is not feasible.
[(b)] (c) Penalty.--A person who operates a properly registered [motorboat] boat that does not display a proper registration number commits a summary offense of the third degree.
§ 5311. Tampering with identification numbers.
(a) General rule.--No unauthorized person shall erase, deface, change, paint on or in any way tamper with any registration number or card or any other identification number on a [motorboat] boat or motor.
(b) Penalty.--Any person who violates this section commits a summary offense of the second degree.

Section 2. This act shall take effect April 1, 1987, or immediately, whichever is later.
