A JOINT RESOLUTION

- Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth 1
- 2 of Pennsylvania, reducing the size of the House of
- 3 Representatives.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- hereby resolves as follows: 5
- 6 Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of
- 7 Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with Article XI:
- 8 That section 16 of Article II be amended to read:
- § 16. Legislative districts.
- The Commonwealth shall be divided into 50 senatorial and 10
- 11 [203] 101 representative districts, which shall be composed of
- compact and contiguous territory as nearly equal in population 12
- 13 as practicable. Each senatorial district shall elect one
- 14 Senator, and each representative district one Representative.
- 15 Unless absolutely necessary no county, city, incorporated town,
- 16 borough, township or ward shall be divided in forming either a
- 17 senatorial or representative district.

- 1 Section 2. Immediately following the approval of this
- 2 amendment by the electorate, the Commonwealth's house
- 3 legislative districts shall be reapportioned in the same manner
- 4 as provided by law for the reapportionment following the
- 5 reporting of the Federal decennial census. The first elections
- 6 after reapportionment of this Commonwealth under section 17 of
- 7 Article II to conform to the foregoing amendment shall be held
- 8 in the year 1990.
