AN ACT

1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania
2 Consolidated Statutes, requiring persons to whom persons
3 suffering burns come or are brought for treatment to make a
4 report to the police.

5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6 hereby enacts as follows:

7 Section 1. Section 5106 of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
8 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:

9 § 5106. Failure to report injuries by firearm or criminal act.

10 (a) Offense defined.--A physician, intern or resident, or
11 any person conducting, managing or in charge of any hospital or
12 pharmacy, or in charge of any ward or part of a hospital, to
13 whom shall come or be brought any person:

14 (1) suffering from any wound or other injury inflicted
15 by his own act or by the act of another by means of a deadly
16 weapon as defined in section 2301 [of this title] (relating
17 to definitions); [or]

1 (2) upon whom injuries have been inflicted in violation
2 of any penal law of this Commonwealth; or

3 (3) suffering burns affecting 5% or more of the injured
4 person's body;

5 commits a summary offense if he fails to report such injuries
6 immediately, both by telephone and in writing, to the chief of
7 police or other head of the police department of the local
8 government, or to the Pennsylvania State Police. The report
9 shall state the name of the injured person, if known, his
10 whereabouts and the character and extent of his injuries.

11 (b) Immunity granted.--No physician or other person shall be
12 subject to civil or criminal liability by reason of making a
13 report required by this section.

14 (c) Physician-patient privilege unavailable.--In any
15 judicial proceeding resulting from a report pursuant to this
16 section, the physician-patient privilege shall not apply in
17 respect to evidence regarding such injuries or the cause
18 thereof.

19 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
