A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating October 14, William Penn's birthday, as
- 2 "Pennsylvania State Flag Day."
- 3 WHEREAS, Pennsylvanians take great pride in their State and
- 4 its official symbols; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Many Pennsylvanians are unfamiliar with the history
- 6 and symbolism of our State flag; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The State flag contains the Pennsylvania coat of
- 8 arms which consists of a shield displaying the emblems of the
- 9 State Seal, the ship, the plough and sheaves of wheat with the
- 10 eagle for the crest, supported by two black horses, an olive
- 11 branch and a corn stalk crossed beneath the shield, above the
- 12 State motto "Virtue, Liberty and Independence"; and
- WHEREAS, The State flag is flown from all State buildings and
- 14 many public buildings within this Commonwealth; and
- WHEREAS, The birthday of the founder of our great

- 1 Commonwealth, William Penn, is October 14; therefore be it
- 2 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives memorialize the
- 3 Governor of the Commonwealth to designate October 14 as
- 4 "Pennsylvania State Flag Day" so that our State flag may be
- 5 properly honored and information disseminated explaining the
- 6 meaning of the flag.
