A RESOLUTION

1 Providing for a select committee to investigate the Pennsylvania
2 Interscholastic Athletic Association.

3 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic
4 Association, because of its broad powers and public function, is
5 subject to oversight by the general public, elected officials
6 and the judicial system; and

7 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic
8 Association has adopted policies which interfere with non-
9 interscholastic athletic competition and training, such as
10 summer sports and recreation programs and the Keystone Games;
11 and

12 WHEREAS, Questions concerning the fiscal practices of the
13 Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association have arisen;
14 and

15 WHEREAS, Members of the House of Representatives have
16 received numerous complaints from constituents and individuals

1 organizing sports and recreation programs and various forms of
2 athletic competition; therefore be it

3 RESOLVED, That the Speaker of the House of Representatives
4 appoint a select committee, four members to be from the majority
5 party and three members to be from the minority party, to
6 investigate the policies and practices of the Pennsylvania
7 Interscholastic Athletic Association; and be it further

8 RESOLVED, That the committee may hold hearings, take
9 testimony and make its investigations at such places as it deems
10 necessary in this Commonwealth. Each member of the committee
11 shall have power to administer oaths and affirmations to
12 witnesses appearing before the committee; and be it further

13 RESOLVED, That the committee shall make a report of its
14 findings to the House of Representatives as soon as its study
15 and investigation are completed together with its findings and
16 recommendations.
