18	WHEREAS, WITHIN THE COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES WHICH RECEIVE	<—

DIRECT INSTITUTIONAL APPROPRIATIONS FROM THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY,
 THERE HAVE EXISTED ONGOING EFFORTS TO PROMOTE RACIAL INTEGRATION
 AND NONDISCRIMINATION; AND

WHEREAS, SUCH EFFORTS ARE THE PROPER AND LEGITIMATE OBJECT OF
OVERSIGHT OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES; THEREFORE BE IT
RESOLVED, THAT THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES DIRECT THE
SUBCOMMITTEE ON HIGHER EDUCATION TO ASSESS THE SUCCESS OF
EFFORTS TO PROMOTE RACIAL INTEGRATION AND NONDISCRIMINATION; and
be it further

10 RESOLVED, That the Subcommittee may hold public hearings, 11 take testimony and make its study at such places as it deems 12 necessary within this Commonwealth. Each member of the 13 Subcommittee shall have the power to administer oaths and 14 affirmations to witnesses appearing before the Subcommittee; and 15 be it further

16 RESOLVED, That the Subcommittee make a report of its 17 findings, together with any recommendations for remedial 18 legislation, to the House of Representatives as soon as 19 possible.
