A RESOLUTION

- 1 Memorializing the Governor to proclaim the week of May 4 through
- 2 11, 1986, as "Days of Remembrance of the Victims of the
- 3 Holocaust."
- 4 WHEREAS, From 1933 to 1945, six million Jews were murdered in
- 5 the Nazi Holocaust as part of a systematic program of genocide,
- 6 and millions of other people perished as victims of Nazism; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The people of this Commonwealth should always
- 8 remember the atrocities committed by the Nazis so that such
- 9 horrors never be repeated and should continually rededicate
- 10 themselves to the principle of equal justice for all people; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The people of this Commonwealth should remain
- 12 eternally vigilant against all tyranny and recognize that
- 13 bigotry provides a breeding ground for tyranny to flourish; and
- 14 WHEREAS, May 6 has been designated pursuant to an Act of

- 1 Congress and internationally as a Day of Remembrance of Victims
- 2 of the Nazi Holocaust, known as Yom Hoshoah; and
- 3 WHEREAS, It is appropriate for the people of this
- 4 Commonwealth to join in the international commemoration;
- 5 therefore be it
- 6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives memorialize the
- 7 Governor to proclaim the week of May 4 through 11, 1986, as the
- 8 "Days of Remembrance of the Victims of the Holocaust" in memory
- 9 of the victims of the Holocaust, and in the hope that we will
- 10 strive always to overcome prejudice and inhumanity through
- 11 education, vigilance and resistance.
