AN ACT

- 1 Regulating the right to practice acupuncture; requiring the
- 2 registration of acupuncturists; and providing a penalty.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Short title.
- 6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Acupuncture
- 7 Registration Act.
- 8 Section 2. Definitions.
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 10 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 12 "Acupuncture." The stimulation of certain points on or near
- 13 the surface of the body by the insertion of needles to prevent
- 14 or alleviate the perception of pain or to normalize
- 15 physiological functions, including pain control, for the
- 16 treatment of certain diseases or dysfunctions of the body.
- 17 "Acupuncturists." An individual registered to practice

- 1 acupuncture by the State Board of Medical Education and
- 2 Licensure.
- 3 "Board." The State Board of Medical Education and Licensure.
- 4 Section 3. Regulation of the practice of acupuncture.
- 5 (a) Registration required.--Acupuncture may be practiced by
- 6 or at the direction and under the supervision of a physician. An
- 7 individual, including a physician, shall be registered with the
- 8 board before the individual may practice acupuncture in this
- 9 Commonwealth.
- 10 (b) Regulations to be promulgated.--The board shall
- 11 promulgate regulations requiring the proper training of
- 12 individuals, including physicians, before they may be registered
- 13 to practice acupuncture in this Commonwealth. Proper training
- 14 shall include to the extent determined by the board, education
- 15 or demonstrated experience in the practice of acupuncture. The
- 16 board may promulgate such other regulations as are deemed proper
- 17 and necessary regarding the practice of acupuncture.
- 18 (c) Practice to be under general supervision of a
- 19 physician. -- An acupuncturist is not required to practice
- 20 acupuncture on the premises of the office of a physician,
- 21 however, an acupuncturist, other than a physician, is required
- 22 to practice acupuncture under the general supervision of a
- 23 physician. The supervising physician is not required to be
- 24 registered with the board as an acupuncturist. "General
- 25 supervision" means the supervising physician shall:
- 26 (1) Perform a medical diagnostic examination or review
- 27 the results of a recently performed medical diagnostic
- 28 examination with respect to any ailment or condition to be
- treated by acupuncture prior to such treatment.
- 30 (2) Be personally available for consultation on the

- 1 premises or be available by telephone contact, chart review
- or other means approved by the board.
- 3 (3) Place conditions and restrictions on the course of
- 4 treatment if required as a matter of sound medical practice.
- 5 (d) Removal from registration. -- The board shall have the
- 6 authority to suspend, revoke or cancel the registration of any
- 7 person who engages in unprofessional conduct or incompetent
- 8 practice, is addicted to drugs or alcohol, or violates any
- 9 provisions of the act or rules or regulations of the board.
- 10 (e) Section not applicable to dentists and podiatrists.--
- 11 This section shall not apply to a dentist performing acupuncture
- 12 in connection with the practice of dentistry or a podiatrist
- 13 performing acupuncture in a connection with the practice of
- 14 podiatry.
- 15 Section 4. Penalties.
- 16 (a) Registration.--Except as provided for in section $\frac{3(d)}{d}$

- 17 3(E), it shall be unlawful for an individual to practice
- 18 acupuncture in this Commonwealth unless the individual is
- 19 registered as an acupuncturist by the board. An individual
- 20 willfully violating the provisions of this section ACT shall be
- 21 guilty of a misdemeanor of the third degree.
- 22 (b) Injunction.--The unlawful practice of acupuncture as
- 23 defined may be enjoined by the courts on petition of the board
- 24 or by the commissioner. In any such proceeding, it shall not be
- 25 necessary to show that any person is individually injured by the
- 26 actions complained of. If the respondent is found guilty of the
- 27 unlawful practice of acupuncture, the court shall enjoin him
- 28 from so practicing unless he has been duly registered. Procedure
- 29 in such cases shall be the same as in any other injunction suit.
- 30 The remedy of injunction shall be in addition to criminal

- 1 prosecution and punishment.
- 2 Section 5. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect immediately. 3
