A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Memorializing the Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission to raise the 1 2 speed limit. 3 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Turnpike was designed as a high-4 speed highway; and 5 WHEREAS, After World War II, the maximum speed was raised 6 from 35 m.p.h. to 70 m.p.h. and later reduced to 65 m.p.h. to 7 conform to other Interstate Highway speeds; and 8 WHEREAS, The present 55 m.p.h. limit was set in response to a 9 fuel shortage emergency; and 10 WHEREAS, The fuel emergency, like World War II, is over, and 11 the Turnpike should once again be used as a high-speed highway; 12 therefore be it 13 RESOLVED (the House of Representatives concurring), That the General Assembly memorialize the Pennsylvania Turnpike 14 15 Commission to raise the maximum speed limit on the Pennsylvania 16 Turnpike to 65 m.p.h.; and be it further 17 RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be sent to the

1 Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission.
