AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of February 11, 1976 (P.L.14, No.10), entitled
- 2 "An act authorizing development of rural and intercity common carrier surface transportation," further providing for grants
- carrier surface transportation, "further providing for grants for transportation; and making an editorial change.
- 4 for transportation, and making an editorial change.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Section 4(3.1) of the act of February 11, 1976
- 8 (P.L.14, No.10), known as the Pennsylvania Rural and Intercity
- 9 Common Carrier Surface Transportation Assistance Act, added
- 10 October 17, 1980 (P.L.1083, No.183), is amended to read:
- 11 Section 4. Program Authorizations. -- The department is hereby
- 12 authorized, within the limitations hereinafter provided:
- 13 * * *
- 14 (3.1) To make grants from the State Lottery Fund to
- 15 transportation companies, county transportation systems and
- 16 local transportation organizations to pay estimated transit

- 1 losses resulting from providing:
- 2 (i) Free service [or] on local common carrier mass
- 3 transportation systems to persons [65 years] 60 years of age or

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- 4 older when such passage is on fixed route public transportation
- 5 services during [nonpeak riding hours and on] all hours of
- 6 operation, including holidays and weekends. The losses resulting
- 7 from granting service on mass transportation systems shall be
- 8 reimbursable at 75% of such system's average fare multiplied by
- 9 the number of trips made by senior citizens participating in
- 10 such free transit program. Transit systems that currently
- 11 receive a program reimbursement based upon a percentage of
- 12 average fare greater than 75% shall receive their current amount
- 13 of senior citizen program reimbursement until such time as the
- 14 amount of reimbursement for these systems equals 75% of the
- 15 average fare times the number of senior citizens trips:
- 16 Provided, however, That reimbursement for the fiscal year 1980-
- 17 1981 shall be calculated using the average fares as of January
- 18 1, 1980.
- 19 (ii) Free or reduced fare on shared ride county
- 20 transportation systems for persons [65] years of age or
- 21 older:
- 22 (A) In case of free service on such county systems, the
- 23 county shall be reimbursed at 75% of the cost incurred or to be
- 24 incurred in operating and maintaining such system, with the
- 25 remainder of any such cost being paid by the county.
- 26 (B) In case of reduced fare services on such county systems,
- 27 the county shall be reimbursed at the same rate and under the
- 28 same conditions as provided in subparagraph (iii).
- 29 (iii) Reduced fare services on local common carrier mass
- 30 transportation systems to persons [65] <u>60</u> years of age or older

- 1 when such passage is on shared ride public or contract
- 2 transportation services during regular hours of operation. On
- 3 shared public transportation, losses are reimbursable only if
- 4 the elderly person pays 25c or 25% of the cost of the individual
- 5 fare, whichever is greater.
- 6 (iv) In no case shall the reimbursements for each succeeding
- 7 year exceed the prior year's reimbursements increased by a
- 8 percentage equal to the percentage increase in granting costs
- 9 for all local transportation organizations, county
- 10 transportation systems and transportation companies for the most
- 11 recently completed State fiscal year as compared to the fiscal
- 12 year immediately preceding such year.
- 13 (v) The department shall promulgate such rules and
- 14 regulations as are necessary to carry out the purposes of this
- 15 subparagraph. In accordance with section 2203-A(27) of the act
- 16 of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as "The Administrative
- 17 Code of 1929," no such regulation shall take effect until they
- 18 are submitted to the Department of Aging for comment.

- 20 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
