1 2 3	Amending Title 71 (State Government) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for limitations on recovery of overpayments.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Section 5954 of Title 71 of the Pennsylvania
7	Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
8	§ 5954. Fraud and adjustment of errors.
9	(a) Penalty for fraudAny person who shall knowingly make
10	any false statement or shall falsify or permit to be falsified
11	any record or records of this system in any attempt to defraud
12	the system as a result of such act shall be guilty of a
13	misdemeanor of the second degree.
14	(b) Adjustment of errorsShould any change or mistake in
15	records result in any member, beneficiary or survivor annuitant
16	receiving from the system more or less than he would have been
17	entitled to receive had the records been correct, then
18	regardless of the intentional or unintentional nature of the

1 error and upon the discovery of such error, the board shall
2 correct the error and so far as practicable shall adjust the
3 payments which may be made for and to such person in such a
4 manner that the actuarial equivalent of the benefit to which he
5 was correctly entitled shall be paid.

6 (c) Limitation on recovery of overpayments. -- Notwithstanding

7 subsection (b), in those instances in which a change or mistake

8 in records results in any member, beneficiary or survivor

9 annuitant receiving more than he would have been entitled to

10 receive had the records been correct, the board shall, in

11 correcting the error and making actuarial adjustments in future

12 payments to the individual or in computing a lump sum repayment,

13 base such correction, adjustment or computation solely on the

14 overpayments made in the three-year period immediately preceding

15 the discovery of the error. This subsection shall not apply in

16 those instances wherein the member, beneficiary or survivor

17 annuitant receiving the overpayment is convicted of fraud under

18 <u>subsection (a).</u>

Section 2. This act shall apply to errors discovered during calendar year 1985 and each year thereafter.

21 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
