AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 1 2 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 3 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 4 Executive Department thereof and the administrative 5 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, б including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 7 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or 8 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 10 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 11 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 12 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 13 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 14 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 15 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 17 and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation of the deputies and all other 18 19 assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and 20 commissions shall be determined, " providing for programs by 21 the Department of Health for persons suffering from 22 Alzheimer's disease.

23 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

24 hereby enacts as follows:

1 Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended by adding a 2 3 section to read: 4 Section 2122. Alzheimer's Disease.--(a) The department 5 shall have the power and its duty shall be: (1) To develop a program to provide respite service programs 6 to persons suffering from Alzheimer's disease or related 7 disorders of aging; 8 (2) To administer the programs, contract with other public 9 10 or private organizations or make grants to provide services 11 under this section for respite and related services which may 12 <u>include:</u> 13 (i) diagnostic and evaluation programs; 14 (ii) day care centers; (iii) temporary care in nursing or boarding homes of other 15 16 institutions; or 17 (iv) in-home visiting or temporary nursing services; 18 (3) To develop rules and regulations to standardize the 19 necessary qualifications of respite service programs for 20 assistance, determine the eligibility of families or individuals 21 for assistance and develop a system of evaluation and review of 22 all programs. 23 (b) No grant, contract or other funding shall be allocated 24 or distributed until the department has received verification of 25 the existence of private funds committed to the program or 26 service for which the funds are to be allocated. No allocation 27 shall exceed the amount of private funding available. 28 (c) All funds under this section shall be obtained by the Commonwealth as a result of the act of August 26, 1971 (P.L.351, 29 30 No.91), known as the "State Lottery Law," and shall be available

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1 <u>as follows:</u>

2	(1) The Secretary of Revenue shall certify the amount of
3	money which is needed to finance other programs required to be
4	administered under the laws deriving fines from the "State
5	Lottery Law" on the effective date of this act; and
6	(2) Any funds in excess of this certified figure may be used
7	for grants for this program up to a maximum of two million
8	<u>dollars (\$2,000,000) in each fiscal year.</u>
9	(d) As used in this section:
10	"Department" means the Department of Health of the
11	Commonwealth.
12	"Respite service program" means a program to assist
13	individuals or families who are providing primary care for an
14	individual with Alzheimer's disease or a related disorder of
15	aging by providing temporary care and assistance to the patient,
16	individual or family.
17	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
