10	Section 1. Section 1077 of the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31,	<—
11	No.21), known as the Public Welfare Code, added December 5, 1980

13	Section 1077. Technical Assistance. (a) The department may	
14	offer and provide upon request technical assistance to	
15	caregivers to assist them in complying with department	
16	regulations.	
17	(b) The department may subcontract with public, private or	
18	nonprofit agencies, associations and corporations in each of the	
19	four regions of this Commonwealth for day care information and	

1	referral services. The subcontractors shall:
2	(1) Provide information on quality care, including
3	standards, type of program, cost, location and availability.
4	(2) Link parents with services and follow through to insure
5	they have received appropriate services.
6	(3) Provide advocacy and troubleshooting.
7	(4) Provide parents with a system for giving consumer
8	feedback.
9	(5) Keep data on the consumers and parents served to augment
10	overall data collection efforts to pinpoint need and patterns of
11	problems.
12	(6) Publicize the needs of parents to others in the day care
13	community.
14	(7) Reach out to share information with pediatricians,
15	religious institutions, teachers, caseworkers and community
16	agencies.
17	(8) Develop and implement a public education and media
18	campaign to educate parents to look for licensed caregivers and
19	licensed facilities and to shop for quality day care.

3 "DEPARTMENT." THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WELFARE OF THE4 COMMONWEALTH.

5 SECTION 3. DEMONSTRATION PROGRAMS.

(A) ESTABLISHMENT.--THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ESTABLISH FOUR 6 DEMONSTRATION PROGRAMS IN THIS COMMONWEALTH TO EVALUATE THE 7 DEVELOPMENT, MAINTENANCE AND EXPANSION OF QUALITY CHILD CARE 8 9 THROUGH REGIONALIZED RESOURCE AND REFERRAL CHILD CARE SERVICES. 10 IN ADDITION, THESE DEMONSTRATION PROGRAMS SHALL ASSESS THE ROLE 11 OF A RESOURCE AND REFERRAL AGENCY IN FURTHERING THE DEPARTMENT'S 12 GOAL TO IMPROVE ACCESS TO CHILD CARE, QUALITY OF CHILD CARE, 13 MONITORING OF CHILD CARE AND PLANNING FOR CHILD CARE SERVICES. 14 TO ACHIEVE COST EFFICIENCY, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL IDENTIFY AND 15 UTILIZE, WHENEVER POSSIBLE, EXISTING RESOURCE AND REFERRAL 16 AGENCIES OPERATING IN THIS COMMONWEALTH.

17 (B) DURATION.--THE PROGRAMS ESTABLISHED UNDER SUBSECTION (A)
18 SHALL OPERATE FOR AT LEAST TWO YEARS. THEY MAY BE CONTINUED IF
19 FUNDING IS AVAILABLE.

20 SECTION 4. ELIGIBILITY.

A CHILD CARE RESOURCE AND REFERRAL AGENCY IS ELIGIBLE TO
PROVIDE A DEMONSTRATION PROGRAM UNDER SECTION 3 IF IT CAN
DEMONSTRATE, THROUGH PAST PERFORMANCE OR CURRENT SERVICE,
ABILITY TO EFFECTIVELY PERFORM THE FUNCTIONS UNDER SECTION 5 AND
IF IT CAN PROVIDE EVIDENCE THAT IT HAS SERVED LOW-INCOME
FAMILIES.

27 SECTION 5. FUNCTION.

28 A CHILD CARE RESOURCE AND REFERRAL AGENCY MUST PROVIDE, AT A29 MINIMUM, THE FOLLOWING SERVICES:

30 (1) IDENTIFICATION OF ALL LEGALLY OPERATING CHILD CARE 19870H1251B3867 - 3 - 1 SERVICES IN A DEFINED GEOGRAPHICAL AREA.

2 (2) MAINTENANCE OF A REGULARLY UPDATED RESOURCE FILE OF
3 SERVICES AND VACANCIES.

4 (3) PUBLIC EDUCATION ABOUT THE AVAILABILITY, COST,
5 STANDARDS AND TYPES OF CHILD CARE PROGRAMS IN A DEFINED
6 GEOGRAPHICAL AREA.

7 (4) ASSISTANCE TO PARENTS IN EVALUATING CHILD CARE NEEDS
8 AND APPROPRIATENESS OF TYPES OF CARE.

9 (5) REFERRALS TO CHILD CARE SERVICES NEAR THE HOME, WORK
10 AREA, OR FACILITY WHERE THE PARENT IS ATTENDING SCHOOL OR
11 RECEIVING JOB TRAINING.

12 (6) PROVIDING CAREGIVERS WITH TRAINING WORKSHOPS,
 13 ASSISTANCE IN FILLING VACANCIES, ADVOCACY FOR ATTAINING
 14 PROFESSIONAL STATUS, OPPORTUNITIES FOR SHARING INFORMATION
 15 AND EXPERIENCES AND ACCESS TO ONGOING EDUCATIONAL

16 CERTIFICATION PROGRAMS.

17 (7) PROVISION OF START-UP INFORMATION FOR POTENTIAL
18 CHILD CARE PROVIDERS TO STIMULATE THE SUPPLY OF CHILD CARE
19 RESOURCES.

20 (8) ABILITY TO RESPOND TO REQUESTS FROM BUSINESSES FOR
21 INFORMATION OR SERVICES DESIGNED TO MEET THE CHILD CARE NEEDS
22 OF THEIR EMPLOYEES.

23 (9) DOCUMENTATION AND TABULATION OF DATA PERTAINING TO
24 PARENT REQUESTS, CONSUMER COMPLAINTS AND EMPLOYER-SPONSORED
25 CHILD CARE SERVICES THAT WILL ASSIST IN COMMUNITY AND STATE
26 PLANNING AND IDENTIFICATION OF NEEDS.

27 (10) PROCEDURES FOR HANDLING COMPLAINTS RELATED TO CHILD
28 DAY-CARE PROGRAMS AND REFERRAL OF DAY-CARE PROGRAMS UNDER
29 INVESTIGATION BY THE DEPARTMENT.

30 (11) ESTABLISHMENT OF FEES, WHERE NECESSARY, TO DEFRAY 19870H1251B3867 - 4 - 1 THE COST OF SERVICES.

2 (12) ESTABLISHMENT OF PROCEDURES THAT ENSURE THE
3 CONFIDENTIALITY OF CHILDREN AND PARENTS WHO UTILIZE THE
4 AGENCY'S SERVICES.

5 SECTION 6. REPORT TO GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

AN INTERIM REPORT THAT DESCRIBES THE FOUR DEMONSTRATION 6 PROGRAMS SELECTED BY THE DEPARTMENT AND THE CRITERIA THAT WILL 7 8 BE USED FOR A FINAL EVALUATION OF EACH PROGRAM SHALL BE 9 SUBMITTED TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY BY JULY 1, 1989. A FINAL 10 REPORT SHALL BE SUBMITTED TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY WITHIN 30 11 MONTHS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ACT. THE REPORT SHALL INCLUDE, ALONG WITH RECOMMENDATIONS, THE DEPARTMENT'S FINDINGS 12 13 RELATING TO NUMBERS OF PARENTS AND CHILDREN SERVED; EXTENT OF 14 ASSISTANCE GIVEN TO CAREGIVERS, PARENTS AND EMPLOYEES; COST OF 15 RESOURCE AND REFERRAL SERVICES; THE AVAILABILITY OF PRIVATE, 16 CORPORATE AND GOVERNMENT FUNDING FOR THE DEVELOPMENT AND 17 MAINTENANCE OF RESOURCE AND REFERRAL AGENCIES; AND THE PROGRAM'S 18 IMPACT ON QUALITY AND AVAILABILITY OF CHILD CARE IN A 19 GEOGRAPHICALLY DEFINED AREA. 20 SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE.

21 THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY.
