AN ACT

Amending Title 20 (Decedents, Estates and Fiduciaries) of the 2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for the 3 transfer of certain real property by the courts. 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 6 Section 1. Section 8301 of Title 20 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended to read: 8 § 8301. Powers of court to authorize sale, etc. of real 9 property. 10 The court of common pleas, operating through its appropriate 11 division, may authorize the sale, mortgage, lease or exchange of 12 real property or grant declaratory relief with respect to real 13 property: Where the legal title is held: 14 15 (i) by a person whose spouse is an incompetent, or has abandoned him or her for one year, or has been absent 16 in circumstances from which the law would presume his or 17

1 (ii) by a tenant of an estate by entireties, when the other tenant of such estate has been absent in 2. 3 circumstances from which the law would presume his or her 4 decease; 5 (iii) by corporations of any kind having no capacity to convey, or by any unincorporated association; [or] 6 (iv) by any religious, beneficial, or charitable 7 society or association, incorporated or unincorporated, 8 whose title is subject to forfeiture if real property is 9 10 held in excess of the amount authorized by law[.]; or (v) by any religious, beneficial or charitable 11 society or association, incorporated or unincorporated, 12 13 whose title is subject to reversion or right of reentry for condition broken if the real property ceases to be 14 15 used for a purpose specified in a deed, subject to the following: 16 17 (A) The petition to declare the real property 18 free from reversion or right of reentry shall contain an affidavit of an officer of the religious, 19 20 beneficial or charitable society or association, stating in detail what reasonable efforts have been 21 22 made to locate or contact the grantor or the 23 grantor's heirs, successors or assigns to obtain a 24 conveyance of the reversion or right of reentry, why 25 the real property should be declared free of the 26 reversion or right of reentry, and the use of the 27 fund, if any, to be derived from sale of the real 28 property.

(B) The court shall have the power to consider all of the circumstances and to grant such equitable

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1	relief as shall be just and proper, and impose such
2	restrictions upon the use of the funds to be derived
3	from sale of real property as the court shall deem to
4	be appropriate to further the religious, beneficial
5	or charitable purpose reflected in the deed
6	containing the reversion or right of reentry for
7	condition broken.

- (2) Where the legal title is an estate tail, or is subject to contingent remainders, executory interests, or remainders to a class some or all of whom may not be in being or ascertained at the time of the entry of the decree.
- 12 (3) Where the legal title is otherwise inalienable.
- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

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
