## AN ACT

- 1 Designating the proposed Greensburg Bypass as the Amos K.
- 2 Hutchinson Bypass.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. The General Assembly finds and declares as
- 6 follows:
- 7 (1) Adequate transportation systems are crucial to the
- 8 public health, safety and economic integrity of a community.
- 9 (2) Central Westmoreland County has for many years
- 10 endured extreme congestion of traffic in the general north-
- south pattern between the Boroughs of Delmont and New Stanton
- which has threatened the safety of the public and thwarted
- 13 economic development.
- 14 (3) The construction of a limited access road artery for
- 15 the north-south pattern in central Westmoreland County would
- 16 relieve such congestion, reduce the threat of catastrophe
- from the transportation of highly combustible and toxic

- 1 materials in densely populated areas, and promote the general
- 2 safety, health and welfare of the public.
- 3 (4) Since his election to the General Assembly in 1968,
- 4 Amos K. Hutchinson of Greensburg, Westmoreland County, has
- 5 advocated an expanded State road network, including a central
- 6 Westmoreland County artery for north-south patterns to
- 7 relieve congestion.
- 8 (5) Representative Amos K. Hutchinson has tirelessly and
- 9 relentlessly pursued construction of a north-south road
- artery in furtherance of the public safety, welfare and
- 11 economic development in central Westmoreland County.
- 12 (6) In 1985, the General Assembly passed Senate Bill No.
- 13 441, which was signed into law as the act of September 30,
- 14 1985 (P.L.240, No.61), known as the Turnpike Organization,
- 15 Extension and Toll Road Conversion Act.
- 16 Section 2. As a fitting tribute to Representative Amos K.
- 17 Hutchinson, the entire Greensburg Bypass, from a point at or
- 18 near Pennsylvania Turnpike Interchange 8 in Westmoreland County
- 19 extending northerly to an interchange with State Route 66
- 20 northwest of Greensburg and continuing northerly to an
- 21 interchange with U.S. Route 22 south of Delmont, is hereby named
- 22 the Amos K. Hutchinson Bypass and shall be designated and posted
- 23 by the Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission as the Amos K.
- 24 Hutchinson Bypass.
- 25 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
