## AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 2 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 3 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative 4 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, 6 including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 7 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or 8 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 10 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 11 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 12 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 13 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 15 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 17 and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation of the deputies and all other 18 assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and 19 20 commissions shall be determined, providing for resident 21 State troopers; and making appropriations.

- 22 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 23 hereby enacts as follows:

- 1 Section 1. Section 205(b) of the act of April 9, 1929
- 2 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929,
- 3 amended December 28, 1972 (P.L.1649, No.349), is amended to
- 4 read:
- 5 Section 205. Pennsylvania State Police. --\* \* \*
- 6 (b) The State Police Force shall consist of such number of
- 7 officers and men, and shall be organized in such manner, as the
- 8 Commissioner of Pennsylvania State Police, with the approval of
- 9 the Governor, shall from time to time determine: Provided,
- 10 however, That [during the fiscal year 1971-1972, the number of
- 11 officers and men shall not exceed in the aggregate at any time,
- 12 three thousand seven hundred ninety persons, and during the
- 13 fiscal year 1972-1973 and thereafter,] the number of officers
- 14 and men shall not exceed in the aggregate at any time three
- 15 thousand nine hundred and forty persons. State policemen, both
- 16 officers and men, assigned to duty with the Pennsylvania
- 17 Turnpike Commission or assigned to duty as resident State
- 18 troopers, shall not be counted in determining the total number
- 19 of officers and men in the State Police Force.
- 20 \* \* \*
- 21 Section 2. Section 712 of the act is amended by adding a
- 22 subsection to read:
- 23 Section 712. The Pennsylvania State Police Force. -- The
- 24 various members of the Pennsylvania State Police are hereby
- 25 authorized and empowered:
- 26 \* \* \*
- 27 (c) To enforce municipal ordinances as well as all other
- 28 laws, civil and criminal, in municipalities which have
- 29 contracted for the services of a resident State trooper under
- 30 section 713. Only the resident State trooper assigned to the

- 1 municipality shall be empowered as provided in this section.
- 2 Section 3. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 3 <u>Section 713. Resident State Trooper Program.--(a) The</u>
- 4 Commissioner of the Pennsylvania State Police may appoint
- 5 members of the regular Pennsylvania State Police Force to be
- 6 resident State troopers, assigned on a regular basis to a
- 7 municipality or adjacent municipalities which do not have an
- 8 organized police force, if the municipality or municipalities
- 9 agree to pay ninety NINETY-FIVE per centum of the cost of
- 10 providing the resident State trooper service. Each resident
- 11 State trooper shall have the same powers and be entitled to the
- 12 same rights and subject to the same rules and regulations as
- 13 <u>other members of the State Police Force.</u>
- 14 (b) In order to implement the resident State trooper
- 15 program, the Commissioner of the Pennsylvania State Police is
- 16 authorized to enter into agreements with boroughs and first and
- 17 second class townships for the furnishing of police protection
- 18 by one or more resident State troopers on a contractual basis.
- 19 The contract price for such services shall be the actual cost of
- 20 providing the police protection, and moneys paid for the police
- 21 services shall be credited to the General Fund and used for the
- 22 express purpose of financing the services for which the contract
- 23 price was paid. Fifty additional personnel are hereby authorized
- 24 to meet the initial staffing requirements of the Pennsylvania
- 25 State Police resulting from any agreements executed pursuant to
- 26 this subsection.
- 27 (c) The Commissioner of the Pennsylvania State Police shall
- 28 promulgate such rules and regulations as may be necessary to
- 29 <u>implement the resident State trooper program and the contractual</u>
- 30 agreements authorized by this section. The rules and regulations

- 1 shall:
- 2 (1) Allow adjacent municipalities to join together to
- 3 request the services of and share in the costs of a resident
- 4 State trooper. If more than one adjacent municipality shall
- 5 request the services of a single resident State trooper, the
- 6 Commissioner of the Pennsylvania State Police may determine that
- 7 the geographic area is too large to be covered by one resident
- 8 State trooper, and that one or more additional resident State
- 9 troopers must be assigned in order to provide the geographic
- 10 <u>area with adequate police protection</u>.
- 11 (2) Require that, as a prerequisite to applying for the
- 12 <u>services of a resident State trooper, a municipality or</u>
- 13 <u>municipalities shall adopt a resolution or ordinance authorizing</u>
- 14 a contractual arrangement with the Pennsylvania State Police for
- 15 the payment by the municipality or municipalities of ninety per
- 16 <u>centum of the costs incurred in connection with the provision of</u>
- 17 the services, with the Commonwealth being responsible for ten
- 18 per centum of the costs.
- 19 (3) Require resident State troopers to remain under the
- 20 <u>direct control of the Pennsylvania State Police with supervision</u>
- 21 to be provided by the commanding officer of the field
- 22 installation having jurisdiction over the municipality or
- 23 municipalities contracting for the services of the resident
- 24 State trooper. The commanding officer shall determine the number
- 25 <u>of supervisors for the resident State troopers assigned to his</u>
- 26 <u>field installation</u>. Each resident State trooper shall operate
- 27 out of his assigned field installation, which shall be his
- 28 <u>official duty station.</u>
- 29 <u>(4) Require all resident State troopers to reside within the</u>
- 30 geographic area served by the field installation having

- 1 jurisdiction over the municipality or municipalities to which
- 2 <u>the resident State trooper is assigned.</u>
- 3 (5) Require that all organizational orders, regulations and
- 4 directives issued by the Pennsylvania State Police apply with
- 5 <u>full force to resident State troopers.</u>
- 6 (6) Require such matters as the geographic area served,
- 7 hours of duty and type of duties to be arranged by the commander
- 8 of the field installation in cooperation with the governing body
- 9 of the municipality or municipalities.
- 10 (7) Require that an on-duty resident State trooper not leave
- 11 <u>his assigned municipality or municipalities without the</u>
- 12 <u>authorization of the commander of the field installation, and</u>
- 13 require that the commander not remove a resident State trooper
- 14 from his area of jurisdiction during assigned hours except in
- 15 cases of extreme emergency, in which case the governing body of
- 16 the contracting municipality or municipalities shall be
- 17 notified.
- 18 (8) Require resident State troopers to be in uniform at all
- 19 times during assigned working hours, unless authorized by the
- 20 commander of the field installation to work in civilian attire.
- 21 (9) Require resident State troopers to enforce all municipal
- 22 ordinances of the contracting municipality or municipalities, as
- 23 well as the Vehicle Code and criminal laws of this Commonwealth.
- 24 (10) Require that all supplies and equipment including
- 25 <u>vehicles</u>, <u>radios</u>, <u>etc.</u>, <u>be obtained by the resident trooper from</u>
- 26 the supervising field installation.
- 27 Section 4. (a) The sum of \$250,000, or as much thereof as
- 28 may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the General Fund
- 29 to the Pennsylvania State Police to pay for the Commonwealth
- 30 share of the costs of the resident State trooper program

- 1 established by this act.
- 2 (b) The sum of \$750,000, or as much thereof as may be
- 3 necessary, is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the
- 4 Pennsylvania State Police to pay for enlarged State Police cadet
- 5 training classes, which shall be needed to implement the
- 6 resident State trooper program authorized by this act.
- 7 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
