Effective date. 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 8 9 CHAPTER 1 PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS 10 11 Section 101. Short title. 12 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Election Day 13 Registration Act. Section 102. Definitions. 14 15 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 16 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 17 context clearly indicates otherwise: 18 "Board" or "county board." The county board of elections. "Department." The Department of State of the Commonwealth. 19 20 CHAPTER 3 ELECTION DAY REGISTRATION 21 22 Section 301. Election day registration. 23 (a) General rule. -- Any person otherwise eligible to vote may 24 register to vote on the day of any primary, municipal or general 25 election by appearing in person at the polling place for the 26 election district in which the individual maintains residence, 27 completing a registration card, making an oath in the form 28 prescribed by the department and providing proof of residence. 29 (b) Proof of residence. -- An individual may prove residence 30 by any of the following methods: 19890H0654B0722 - 2 -

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(1) By displaying a valid driver's license.

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(2) By showing any document approved by the department.

3 (3) By the written statement of an elector registered to 4 vote in that election district, sworn to in the presence of a 5 judge of elections, stating to the effect that the elector 6 personally knows that the individual is a resident of the 7 election district. An individual who has been vouched for on 8 election day may not sign a proof of residence oath vouching 9 for any other individual on that election day.

10 Section 302. Procedure.

(a) Judges of elections.--Voter registration under this act shall be conducted by judges of elections. A judge who registers an individual voter shall not process that voter's ballot at any time prior to opening of the ballot box after the voting ends.

15 (b) Registration cards.--Registration cards and forms for oaths shall be available at each polling place. If an individual 16 17 who registers on election day proves residence under section 18 301(b)(B), the form containing that statement shall be attached 19 to the individual's registration card. Registration cards 20 completed on election day shall be forwarded to the appropriate county board, which shall add the name of each voter to the 21 registration rolls unless the information forwarded is 22 23 substantially deficient. Each judge of elections registering a 24 person on election day shall initial the voter registration card 25 of that person.

(c) Deficient registration.--A county board which finds an election day registration substantially deficient shall mail written notice of same to the individual. An election day registration shall not be found deficient solely because the individual who provided proof of residence was ineligible to do 19890H0654B0722 - 3 - 1 so.

2 Section 303. Maps.

3 The county board shall provide each polling place with a 4 detailed map showing election districts in order to assist 5 judges of elections in determining whether an address is located 6 in that district.

Section 304. Record of attempted registrations. 7

8 The judge of elections responsible for election day registration at each polling place shall keep a record of the 9 10 number of individuals who attempt to register on election day 11 but who cannot provide proof of residence as required by this act. This record shall be forwarded to the county board with the 12 13 election returns for that election district.

14 Section 305. Verification by mail.

15 Within ten days of an election, each county board shall send 16 a notice to a random sampling of no less than 25% of individuals 17 registered on election day. The random sampling shall be 18 determined in accordance with the rules of the department. As 19 soon as practicable after the election, the board shall mail 20 registration verification notices to all individuals registered on election day. If a notice is returned as not deliverable, the 21 22 board shall attempt to determine the reason for the return. A 23 county board which does not receive or obtain satisfactory proof of an individual's eligibility to vote shall immediately notify 24 25 the district attorney and the department.

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CHAPTER 5

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ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTIES

28 Section 501. Prohibited acts.

29 (a) Offenses enumerated.--It shall be unlawful:

30 (1)To cause an individual's name to be registered in 19890H0654B0722 - 4 -

1 any election district if that individual is not eligible to 2 vote.

3 (2) To cause an individual's name to be registered for 4 the purpose of voting in more than one election district or 5 in any election district in which the individual does not maintain residence. 6

To misrepresent an individual's identity when 7 (3) attempting to register to vote. 8

(4) To aid, abet, counsel or procure any other 9 individual to violate this act. 10

11 (5) For a judge of elections to allow an unregistered voter to vote in any election. 12

13 (b) Grading.--A violation of this section constitutes a misdemeanor of the second degree. 14

Section 502. Enforcement. 15

Prosecution for violations of this act shall be brought by 16 the district attorney, upon information supplied by the 17 18 department, a county election officer or any person.

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## MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

CHAPTER 11

Section 1101. Construction of act. 21

22 This act shall be constructed as providing a procedure for registration in addition to those methods as are now provided by 23 24 law.

25 Section 1102. Rules and regulations.

26 The department shall, in the manner provided by law,

27 promulgate the rules and regulations necessary to carry out this 28 act.

Section 1103. Repeal. 29

30 All acts and parts of acts are repealed insofar as they are 19890H0654B0722 - 5 -

1 inconsistent with this act.

2 Section 1104. Application of act.

3 This act shall apply to the municipal or general election 4 occurring in the year next following the year of final enactment 5 of this act, and to each primary, municipal and general election 6 thereafter.

- 7 Section 1105. Effective date.
- 8 This act shall take effect immediately.
